VETERAN'S HOME IS IN JEOPARDY OF BEING FORECLOSED OR IS IN FORECLOSURE

VETERAN NEEDS ASSISTANCE WITH AN EVICTION OR TO RELOCATE AFTER AN EVICTION

PROPERTY TAX ASSISTANCE (owing \$2000 OR LESS) that will result in an immanent foreclosure.

TAX, LAND **CONTRACT OR** MORTGAGE **FORECLOSURE**

Veteran may be eligible for Property Tax assistance if TOTAL owing for all past due years is less than \$2000. Home must be in Judicial Tax foreclosure or Forfeiture status and payment necessary to restore ownership or prevent forfeiture to county. Housing must be affordable (affordability = Total monthly shelter expenses cannot exceed 75% of net available income) for veteran to meet eligibility requirements. If amount owing for all years is greater than \$2000, then request will be denied. Veteran or vet representative may



SCREENING

For screening into the program, contact the VCRRC:

VETERANS COMMUNITY RESOURCE AND REFERRAL CENTER (VCRRC) (313) 576-1580

A one-stop shop for homeless veterans or who are at risk of homelessness providing immediate access to shelter, referrals to community-based economic assistance, and substance abuse treatment. Free transportation provided to the VCRRC with advance notice.

SER - The State Emergency Relief (SER) Program provides immediate help to individuals and families facing conditions of extreme hardship or for emergencies that threaten health and safety. Administered by Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) offices. ESG - Emergency Support Grant - Grants to States, metropolitan cities, urban counties and U.S. territories for eligible activities, generally including essential services related to emergency shelter, rehabilitation and conversion of buildings to be used as emergency shelters, operation of emergency shelters, and homelessness prevention services.
