Employee at Lincoln High School arraigned on criminal sexual conduct charges with students

Mt. Clemens, MI - The Macomb County Prosecutor's Office charged and arraigned Jaren Johnson, 22 years of age in the Warren District Court with eight counts including criminal sexual conduct in the first degree, a life offense.

It is alleged that the defendant who was a hall monitor at Lincoln High School in Warren met multiple victims at the school. His actions were alleged, that he engaged in sexual conduct on school property with a 14 year old girl. Johnson is charged with three counts of criminal sexual conduct in the first degree, two counts accosting a minor, two counts distributing sexually explicit material and one count using a computer to send explicit material.

At the arraignment Judge Suzanne Faunce set the bond at \$500,000 cash/surety. If the bond is posted, Johnson is to have no contact with the victims or anyone under 18 years of age, and wear a GPS tether.

"Children should be safe in school and on school property. These are very serious charges that will be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law to protect our children and keep them from being harmed," said Macomb County Prosecutor Peter J. Lucido.

All that are accused of crimes are presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.
