PRESENTATION BY PLANTE MORAN OF ANNUAL AUDIT REPORT-Y/E NOVEMBER 20, 2018

Steve Bondar reported an unmodified opinion on the annual audit report. This indicates a high level of assurance the statements are materially accurate and is consistent with prior years.

Veronica Cook reviewed the end of audit letter provided to the Board. They did not observe a deficiency in internal controls. Tom Kalkofen questioned a statement made in the report indicating the authority does not have a policy for custodial risk. Is this something that needs to be pursued? Veronica confirmed that it is a county policy discussing with the board if there are too any assets with one bank or custodian. County does monitor it. Should not be a concern to the Board. Also regarding the excess of expenditure over appropriations, it should be indicated that the collections were much higher than budgeted.

PRESENTATION BY THE DETROIT ZOOLOGICAL SOCIETY

Paul Good provided an update. Interesting year at the zoo. A rainy, cold spring did cause an attendance issue. Then came the summer heat which also had an impact. Still the zoo was just a little below the budgeted goal. The Red Panda Exhibit was added in the spring, proving to be a great addition. They are days away from opening the Tiger Habitat which is 3 times larger than before. Unique viewing towers will be available offering close proximity to the tigers. Additions to the backside of the giraffe habitat will provide a holding area for the public, offering interaction with the giraffe. There is a smart flower solar collector at the zoo. When it opens it tracks the sun giving 33% more efficiency. It provides the power that runs the carousel. This is the only zoo that has a smart flower. September 13 & 14 we will "Meet your best friend" at the zoo. 500-600 adoptions are processed during this event. Approximately 4800 comp tickets have been provided to non-profit organizations. Working with temporary shelters (approximately 13) providing special hours for these groups to attend the zoo. Paul provided the annual report and 5 year economic impact analysis. The Great Lakes Nature Center site is currently in negotiation. Should be moving forward within the next several weeks.
