

Dear Mayor & Council,

I am pleased to report that following a recent bond refinancing, the ratepayers of St. Clair Shores, Roseville and Eastpointe will be realizing \$483,414.81 in savings on the Lake St. Clair Initiative Bond. This is slightly more than we had estimated in a previous communication. The bond, which paid for a number of water quality and sewer upgrades several years ago, has 9 years remaining until it is paid off.

Since taking office in 2017, my team at MCPWO has been closely review all existing contracts, bonds and other documents, looking for efficiencies and savings not only in your communities, but across all of our systems. With this latest action, we are now over \$11.1 million in refinance savings across Macomb County! These savings help to allow both MCPWO and our local municipal partners to provide the best service to our ratepayers at the best cost.

As you know, we are currently engaged in a major upgrade and expansion of the Chapaton Retention Basin, which serves St. Clair Shores and Eastpointe, and are working closely with SEMSD and the other drainage districts in the three communities, all with an eye to improve water quality and enhance the quality of life for our residents.

Over the next couple of months, we will update you further on our maintenance projects scheduled for 2020. It will be a busy year in for us in Southeast Macomb County and we look forward to your continued cooperation as we continually look for ways to improve our system.

Subject: Request to Transfer Surplus Lake St. Clair Clean Water Initiative Funds

Background

The 2004 Lake St. Clair Clean Water Initiative (LSCCWI) bonds financed construction of sewer improvements in St. Clair Shores. The project came in under budget, therefore excess bonds funds are available. In 2017 and 2018, the LSCCWI board approved two transfers of a portion of the excess bond funds. The transfers were for the cleanout of the Hetchler Relief Drain (\$180,000) and a storm sewer outlet study for the Martin Drain (\$100,000) as requested by the City and as approved by bond counsel. Today \$738,000 of excess funds remain and St. Clair Shores has requested these funds be transferred to the 8.5 Mile Relief Drain Drainage District to help fund the Chapaton Canal Expansion and In-system Storage projects. These projects will greatly improve Lake St. Clair water quality by reducing combined sewer overflows at Chapaton by 75%.

Recommended Motion

To transfer the balance of the excess Lake St. Clair Clean Water Initiative funds (approximately \$738,112) to the 8.5 Mile Relief Drain Drainage District for the Chapaton Combined Sewer Overflow (CSO) reduction projects.
