

The meeting was called to order by the Chair, Candice Miller. A motion was made by Mr. Mijac, supported by Mr. Santo to approve the agenda as presented.

The meeting was opened to public participation, then closed, there being no comments from the public.

Mr. Downing updated the board that Segment 5 documents will be out for bid tomorrow, and we plan to bring the award of bids to the board on June 8, 2020.

The drop-shaft rehab project is behind schedule due to contractor issues due to COVID19. We have asked for clarification on when they will be able to start the work.

We began working with FK Engineering on the Segment 6 design 15 mile interceptor rehab, and are working to finalize the contracts and design.

Mr. Baker updated the board that the insurance renewal policy will have a 2% increase. We still do not have the 3 year history to get additional quotes. The cost will be split among each of the drainage districts (8.5, Martin, and MIDDD). A charge of \$5,102 will be added to the cost of the policy for terrorism risk insurance.

A motion was made by Mr. Santo, supported by Mr. Mijac to approve the Chapter 20 General Liability Insurance coverage renewal with Argonaut Insurance Company in the amount of \$189,369 and \$5,102 for terrorism risk insurance (MIDD share \$186,692.16)

Mr. Astorino updated the board that last year the board approved Phase 1 of the Aquasight project, which is running very well. We would like to begin Phase 2 to bring meter data access to all the MIDD communities. Each community will have their own access, see their own sites in real time, and get reports on their systems. It will also give access to consultants which will save us time not processing data requests. There will also be more detailed reporting and analytic features.

A motion was made by Mr. Mijac, supported by Mr. Santo to approve the proposal from Aquasight in the amount of \$258,233 for sewer data meter analytics software development and three-year maintenance agreement.

GLWA Savings

On April 22, 2020, the Great Lakes Water Authority (GLWA) approved a three month delay to its previously approved wholesale sewer increase for fiscal year 2021. This action results in a reduction to the approved MIDD costs and charges on April 13, 2020 of \$261,855. In order to pass these savings on to the MIDD communities and their customers effective July 1, 2020, we need to revise the MIDD budget. The savings will result in a 0.3% reduction to the previously adopted MIDD charges. The average sewer charge increase will decline from a 3.5% to a 3.2% adjustment – the second lowest increase in the past 10 years.

Legal Cost Reimbursement

On April 29, 2020, the Michigan Supreme Court denied Sterling Heights' application for leave to appeal the October 1, 2019 Court of Appeals ruling in favor of the MIDD. Sterling Heights was the only MIDD community to challenge the 2016 sinkhole assessment and attempt to force the MIDD to sue Macomb County.

The MIDD had to unnecessarily spend \$143,781 on legal costs defending the lawsuit and two subsequent appeals. MCPWO repeatedly informed Sterling Heights we intended to assess them these costs during both the initial case and the appeals.

The revised budget includes assigning these costs to Sterling Heights. This results in a reimbursement to the MIDD, and an offsetting charge reduction savings to the other 10 MIDD communities, <u>further lowering their average charges for next fiscal year by 0.2%.</u>

With both actions, the average MIDD community will see a 0.5% total reduction from the previously approved MIDD costs and charges effective July 1, 2020, while Sterling Heights will see only a 0.2% increase.

The MIDD will begin the formal assessment process for these legal operating costs under the State Drain Code subsequent to budget adoption.

MIDD Community Leaders

I am pleased to inform you that the Great Lakes Water Authority (GLWA) this week approved a pause in the scheduled increase of wholesale water and sewer charges. The scheduled July 1, 2020 charge adjustment will now be pushed back until October 1, 2020. This action will provide \$5.65 million of relief for community Water & Sewer Funds, as well as an opportunity to pass these savings on to your retail customers.

By delaying the effective date of its adjustment to the charges by one quarter of the fiscal year, GLWA member partners will experience a 25% percent decrease in the increase to their wholesale water and sewer costs. This decrease will allow communities the flexibility to adjust their operations and cash flows to better provide services and account for any potential lag in collections. The action also gives GLWA the ability to make necessary spending or budget adjustments over time as the future impact of the current COVID-19 pandemic is better understood.

You will be receiving additional information from GLWA shortly. In the meantime, I am requesting both the OMID and the MIDD boards update their previously approved schedule of sewer charges reflecting these savings. We would hope you pass these savings on to your customers as well. This action will lower the average increase for the year to a 3.2% sewer adjustment – the second lowest increase in the past ten years and well below the average 15% annual increases experienced from 2010 to 2016.

This pause will give your community just a little extra breathing room as we all work to determine the best way forward in these unprecedented times.

Also be reminded that recent changes to GLWA's Water Residential Assistance Program (WRAP) have recently been approved to increase participation. The income guidelines were expanded from 150% to 200% of poverty level, low income seniors and disabled residents are no longer capped at 2 years of eligibility, and renters are also now eligible for free plumbing repairs. These program changes will greatly benefit more residents especially during this time.
