

The meeting was called to order by the Chair, Candice Miller. The agenda was approved as presented.

Minutes of the meeting of September 11, 2017 were presented and approved, on a motion by Mr. Santo and supported by Ms. Tocco and unanimously carried.

The meeting was opened to public participation, then closed, there being no comments from the public.

Mr. Bednar provided an update on recent work. A walk-through of the drain was completed. Sediment samples were tested and found to be typical of sediment debris from roadways. The samples had low e.coli levels and did not detect PCBs. Water samples taken from drains flowing into the 11 ½ Mile Relief had very small traces of e.coli. Once all structures have been located and entered into GIS, tapes will be reviewed to identify structural repairs needed. A report of the findings will be prepared and presented to the board in the near future.

A motion to receive and file the progress report update given by Mr. Bednar was made by Mr. Santo, supported by Ms. Tocco and unanimously approved.

The Chair presented the invoice totaling \$3,000.00 to the board for review and approval.

Motion was made by Ms. Tocco supported by Mr. Santo to approve the invoice as presented.

A motion to receive and file the financial report given by Mr. Manning was made by Mr. Santo, supported by Ms. Tocco and unanimously carried.

Report Period – September 4, 2017 to October 1, 2017

The following is a summary of work completed to date, and the anticipated work for the next month:

### Work accomplished during the report period:

### 1. Field Inspections

- a. FTCH field staff collected the locations of the remaining manholes and catch basins using the Global Positioning System (GPS) for the 11 1/2 Mile Relief Drain.
- b. Doetsch Environmental installed the bulkhead and dewatered the 11 1/2 Mile Relief Drain for television inspection.
- c. Doetsch Environmental completed the television inspection for the remaining sections of the 11 1/2 Mile Relief Drain.
- d. Doetsch Environmental collected six water samples from laterals into the drain. The samples were analyzed by Chapaton staff and no evidence of sanitary connections were found. This work was done independently of the SAW Grant.

### Anticipated work items for the upcoming report period:

### 1. Field Inspections

- a. FTCH will begin survey of the remaining manholes and catch basins on the Stephens Relief Drain.
- b. FTCH will begin inspection of the remaining manholes on the 11 1/2 Mile and Stephens Relief Drains.
- c. Doetsch Environmental will install the bulkhead, dewater, and inspect the remaining sections of the Stephens Relief Drain.
- e. Doetsch Environmental will collect water samples found entering the Stephens Relief Drain from laterals and have them analyzed at Chapaton. This work will be done independently of the SAW Grant.

### 2. Data Analysis

- a. FTCH to continue updating the GIS database with the information found during sewer televising and manhole inspection.
- b. FTCH to begin analyzing the results of the sewer inspections as Doetsch Environmental completes the work.
