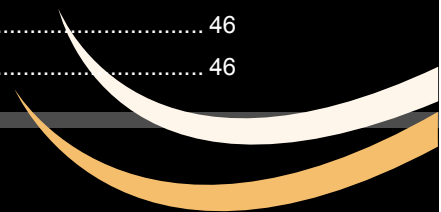

# A Letter from the Office of the Sheriff

The Macomb County Sheriff's Office is committed to protecting the citizens of Macomb County, as well as those who work and visit our County. Our mission statement "determined to keep your trust, working to keep you safe" is exercised everyday by the 524 men and women that are employed by the Sheriff's Office. There are many components of the Sheriff's Office, each one critical in providing effective service to the community, while keeping our citizens, neighborhoods and businesses safe each day.

The care and custody of inmates housed at the Macomb county Jail and service related to that care, custody and transportation of inmates make up over 70% of our budget and operations. The rated design capacity is currently 1,238 beds and we are near capacity on a daily basis. The staff that works in the jail are highly trained Correction Deputies who have to supervise a difficult population that are diagnosed with substance use and mental health disorders. Also challenging our staff are inmates that can't comply with our laws nor follow the rules of the Macomb County Jail. These facts do not deter our staff for reporting to duty and performing their responsibilities in the most exemplary way.

Our law enforcement component is comprised of highly training Deputy Sheriffs and Dispatchers who handle 911 calls, respond to emergencies and request for services, investigations and prosecute crimes committed in Macomb County. We are the largest E911 dispatch center in Macomb County. Our consolidation with communities continues to result in increased effectiveness and efficiency. Our office also provides ancillary services in the areas of Auto Theft, Computer Crimes, Narcotics, Fugitive Apprehension and Major Crimes. We continue to use technology to our advantage and keep up to date with the ever changing trends in law enforcement to protect our citizens.

The Sheriff's Office is tasked with Court Security at the Circuit and District Court levels, as well as transporting incarcerated inmates to their court hearings throughout the County. Inmates are also taken to doctor appointments for treatment outside the jail and our court services section picks up prisoners arrested on warrants anywhere in the State. As you can imagine, the men and women in this unit drive thousands of miles a year while maintaining the safety and security of prisoners while on the road.

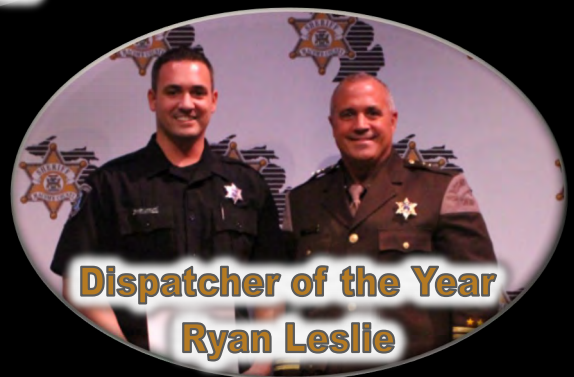
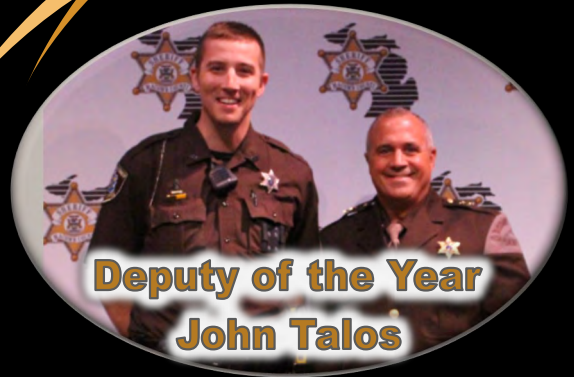

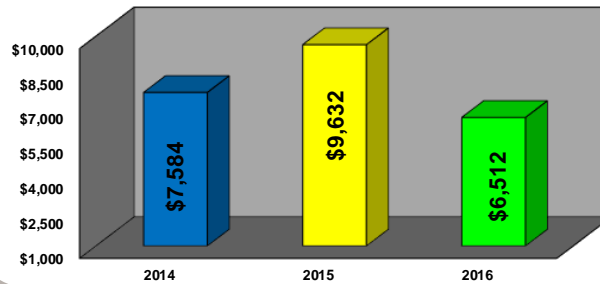
Reimbursement Grants Law Enforcement

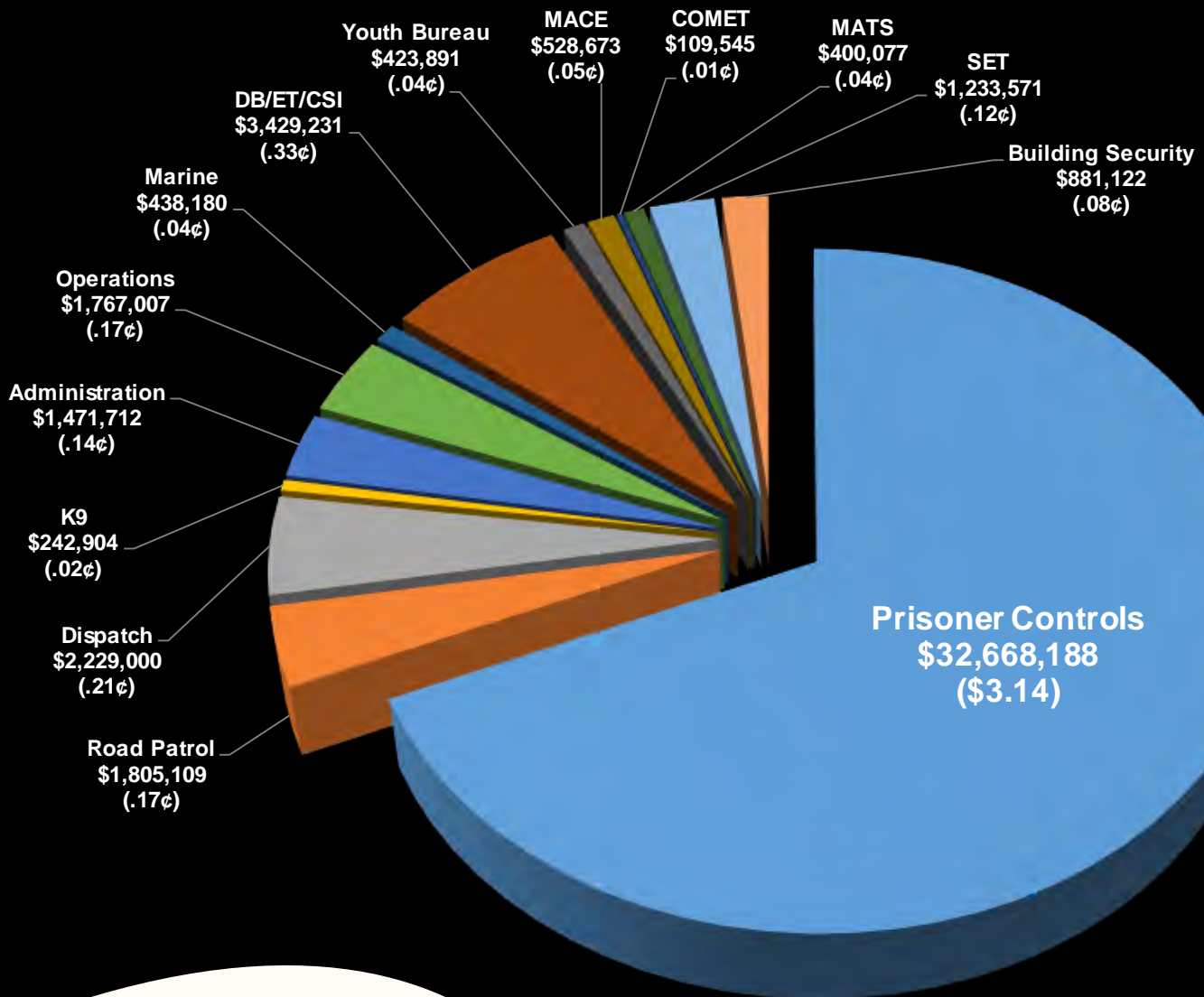

## 2016 Sheriff's Net Budget - By Unit

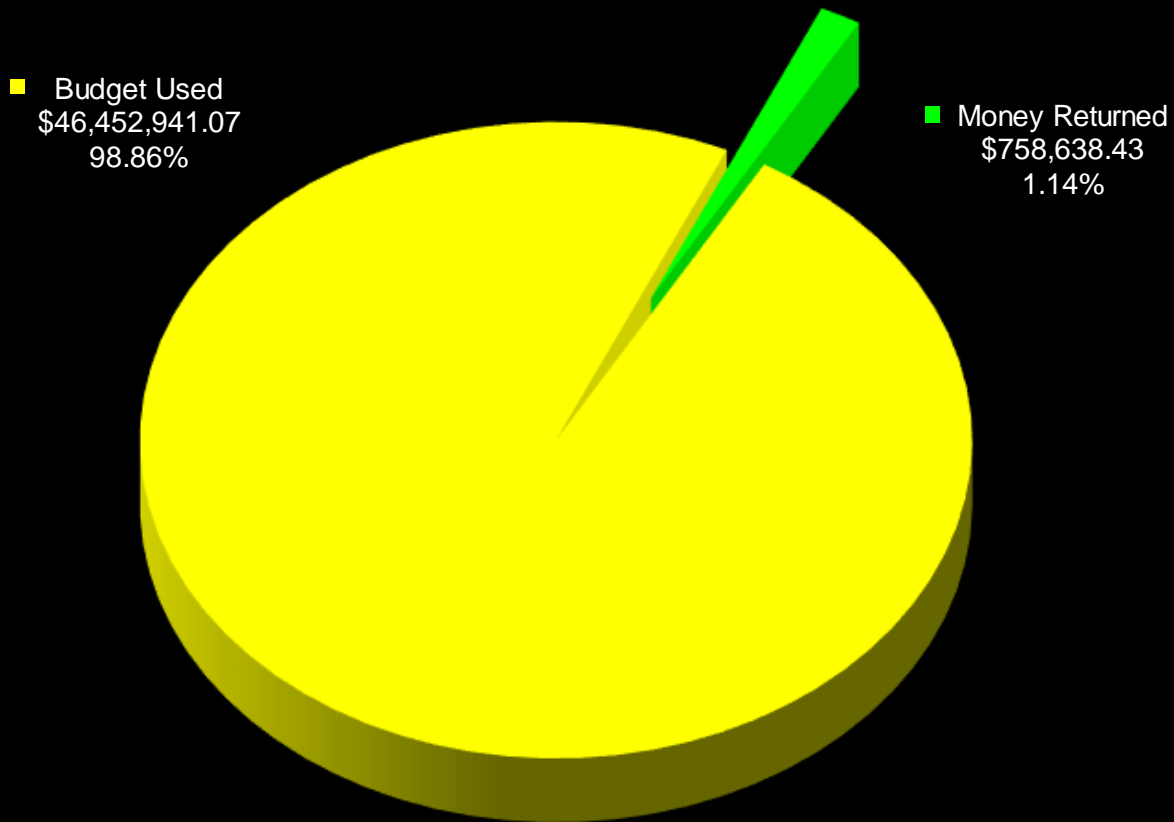
Cost per person/per month

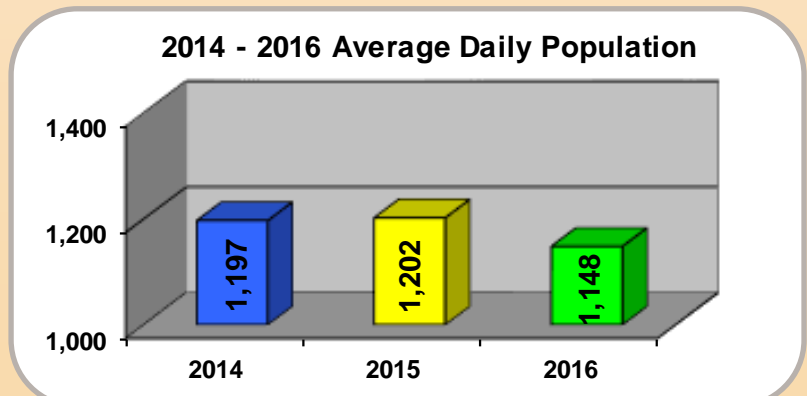
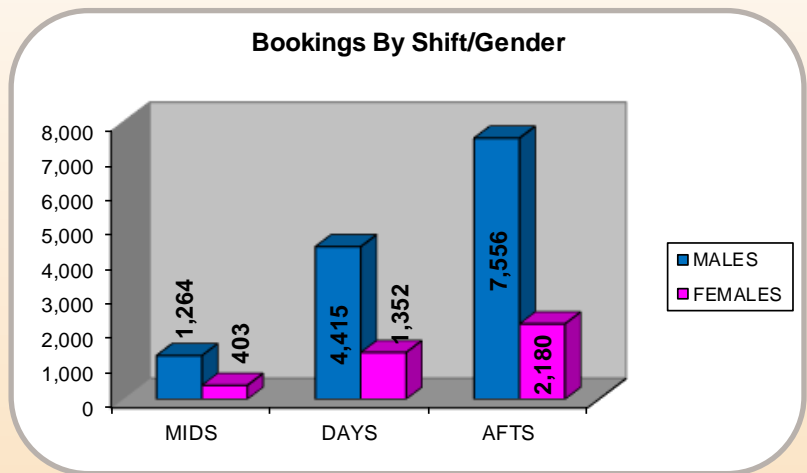


The Macomb County Jail is staffed by Deputies and Command Officers, as well as support staff. These individuals are responsible for the care and custody of all prisoners, the well being of staff, and maintaining security and order within the jail facility.

The courts through their Jail Bed Allocation plan and alternative sentencing assists in keeping the jail population below the design capacity. The Jail's Rated Design Capacity is 1,238.



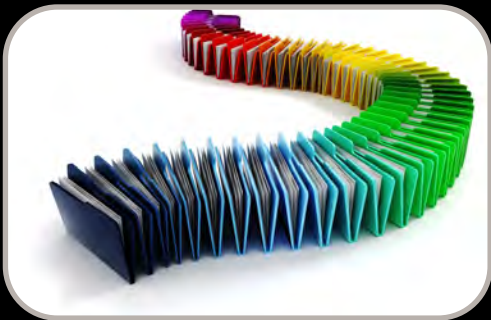
In 2016, a total of 17,170 new prisoners were booked into this facility. This number consisted of 13,235 males and 3,935 females. An average of one prisoner was booked into the jail every 30 minutes. Of those booked, 39% were felony charges and 46% were misdemeanor charges and 15% were non public or miscellaneous. There were 17,179 inmates released during 2016.



# Prisoner Information

Our Jail Office staff is responsible for inmate tracking for bookings, releases, bonds, transports, court dispositions, sentences, and processing Sex Offender Registrations.

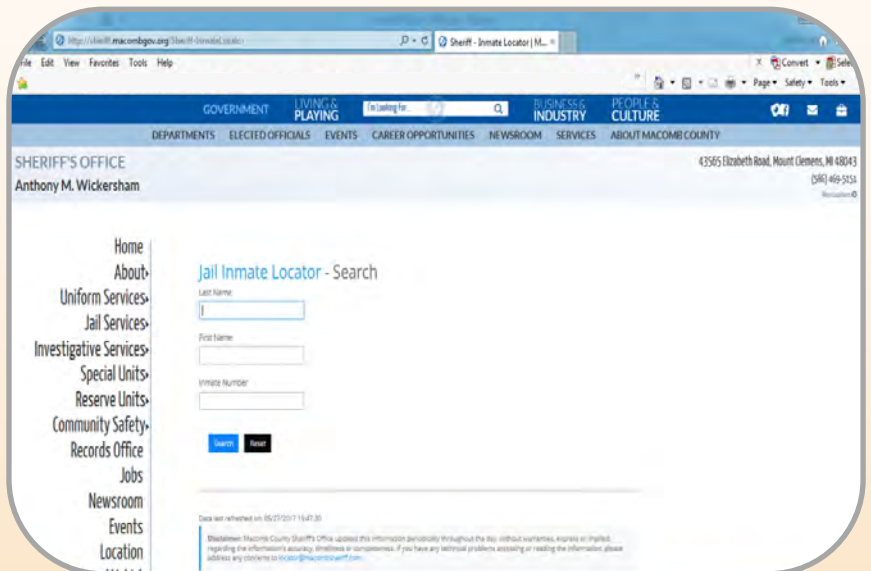
In 2016, our staff added 25,277 charges, disposed of 25,029 charges, updated court information on 32,248 inmate files, added 13,326 holds and added 7,497 sentences to inmate files.



They also handled \$1,642,311 in bond monies and collected \$4,687 in warrant collection fees.



The **Inmate Locator** application is available to the public allowing you to check on inmate status, bond information, and visiting information. It is accessible through the internet at the MacombSheriff.com website.



The **Jail Interactive Voice Response (IVR)** system is an automated phone system to expedite incoming calls and answer questions for the public regarding information on current inmates such as their bond and visiting day. This is accessible when calling the Prisoner Information Office phone number.

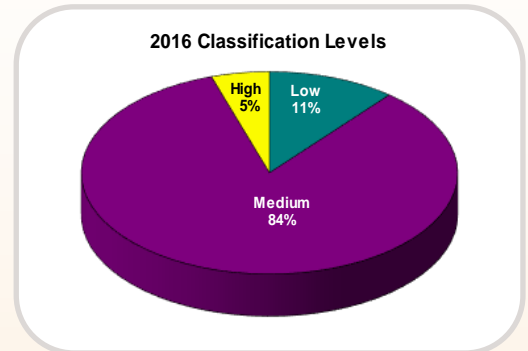

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# Classification Bureau



The Macomb County Sheriff's Office utilizes an objective classification plan to provide fair and consistent guidelines in determining prisoner assignments to housing areas, security level, treatment and program services. Original classifications and periodic reviews are performed to accommodate changes in charges, behavior, and to better align the jail population.



# Prisoner Food Services

Continental Canteen provides food services for the Macomb County Jail. Prisoner trustees help with food preparation and serving. These services include basic meals and commissary sales. Meals cost approximately \$.99 cents per meal based upon the population count of inmates. Cost savings continue to be sought.

# Prisoner Health Services

Correct Care Solutions Inc. provides medical, mental health, dental and related healthcare to inmates at the Macomb County Jail.

Some of the services include preliminary screening of inmates upon arrival, a comprehensive health evaluation, regularly scheduled sick call, 24-hour nursing coverage, physician visits on-site, hospitalization, medical specialty services and administrative support.

Approximately \$4.9 million dollars was spent in 2016 for prisoner healthcare.

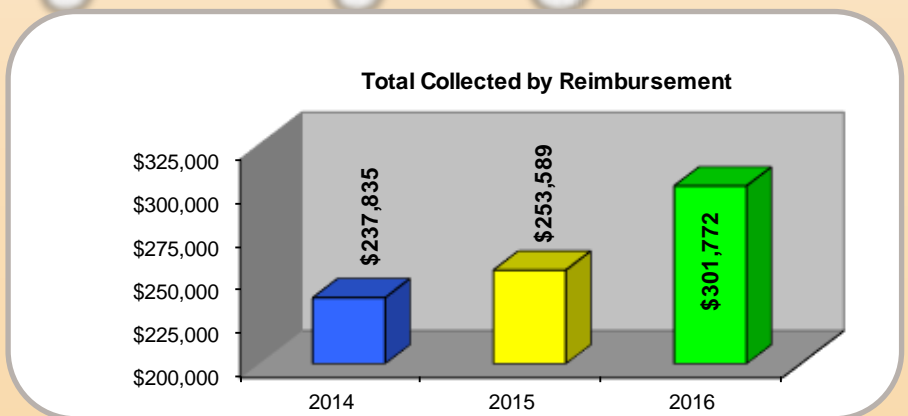

# Prisoner Pay-to-Stay Program

In 1985, the jail reimbursement program (Pay-to-Stay) was implemented at the Macomb County Jail. The purpose of the program is to seek reimbursement from prisoners to help defray the cost of housing.

Technological advancements are continually being evaluated in an effort to improve this process and increase the amount of funds recovered.



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# Correctional Education



Correctional education services are provided by the L'Anse Creuse Public School District. They provide staff at the jail for adult basic education, G.E.D. Testing, high school completion and other related educational services.



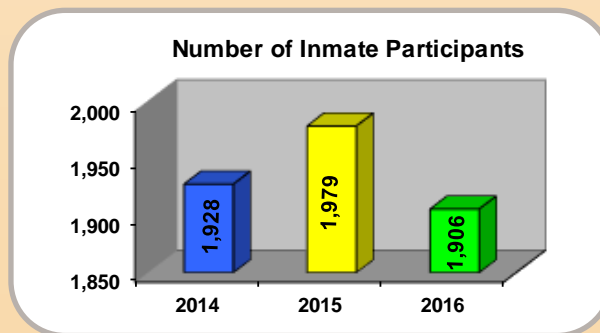

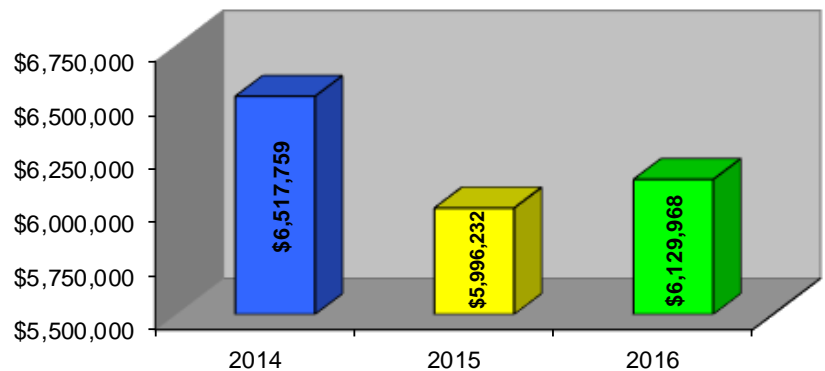


## Mission Statement

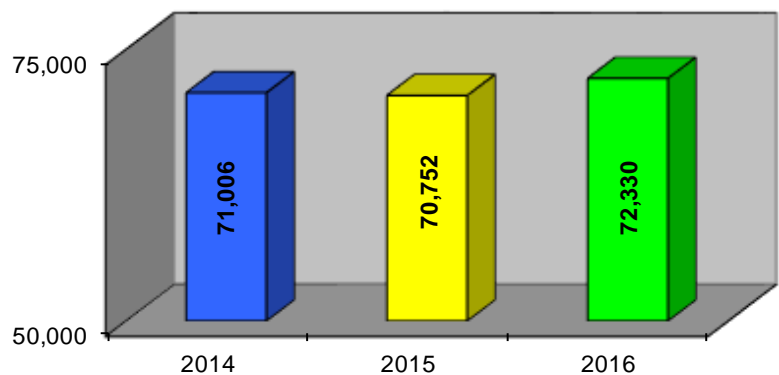
*Macomb County Community Corrections mission is to provide effective, local, community-based alternatives to incarceration that promote public safety, hold offenders accountable, and improve their ability to live lawfully and productively in the community.*

Macomb County Community Corrections is a community based sanction and rehabilitative program aimed at relieving prison and jail overcrowding through Court-approved sentencing alternatives. Non-violent offenders are placed into community sanctions, rather than in jail or prison, to allow for corrections space for more serious offenders. Rehabilitative and monitoring options include substance abuse inpatient and outpatient treatment, monitoring services, substance use testing, community service work, cognitive programming and pre-trial release supervision.

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# Mental Health Diversion

This diversion program is run by the Macomb County Community Mental Health Department and identifies Macomb County residents in jail, or out on bond, who have mental health problems.

The intent of this program is to link offenders with services and support outside of the jail to ensure that all aspects of their mental health treatment are being met.

# Jail Ministry



The Macomb County Jail Ministry Team consists of 2 Clergy and over 100 Volunteers from various local denominations in the community.

In addition to 1,615 Clergy visits, the Macomb County Jail Ministry Team conducts regular religious services. During the year 2016, 1,477 worship services were conducted with 17,286 inmates attending.

The Ministry program also provides Bibles, clothing for released inmates, a book library, stamped envelopes, bus tickets and food certificates upon release. Christmas gifts are also distributed to prisoners and their children.

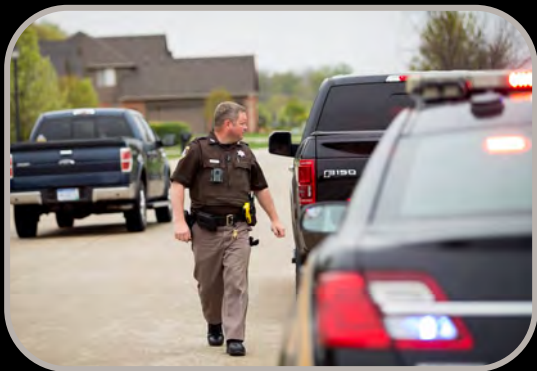
Eight communities contract with the Macomb County Sheriff's Office for 24/7 police services and/or dispatch services.

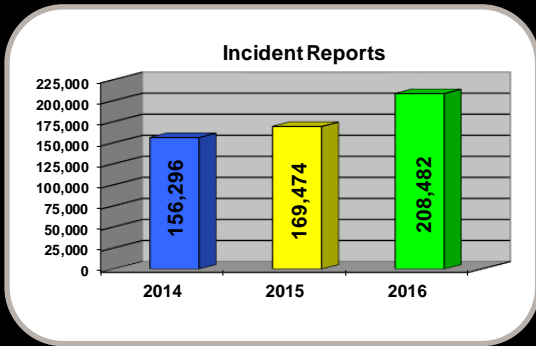

# Communications Division



Macomb County Sheriff's dispatchers provide dispatch services for law enforcement, emergency medical services and fire emergencies. These calls include 911 emergency calls, crimes in progress, traffic issues as well as general assistance to citizens in the community. The dispatch center also provides dispatching services to coordinate multi jurisdictional efforts among various agencies in the county.

Dispatch services are provided for twelve communities, eleven fire departments and one emergency medical service. In 2016 dispatchers handled 344,309 total calls. Cell phone calls continue to grow in the percentage of calls received.

# Traffic Bureau



The responsibilities of the Macomb County Sheriff's Office Traffic Bureau include investigating motor vehicle crashes, motor carrier laws, traffic enforcement, and special event enforcement wherever the need may arise in Macomb County.

In 2016, the Traffic Bureau secured \$481,089 from the Office of Highway Safety Planning for Secondary Road Patrol.

Our department handled 4 fatal accidents this year resulting in 5 total fatalities which equates to a 69% decrease in fatal accidents from 2015.

Other Traffic Bureau operations include processing abandoned vehicles (800), motor carrier enforcement/inspections (200) and child safety seat inspections (115).



The Traffic Bureau issued 50 violations to motorists who failed to yield to school bus drivers. The Sheriff's Traffic Bureau is committed to keeping children safe.





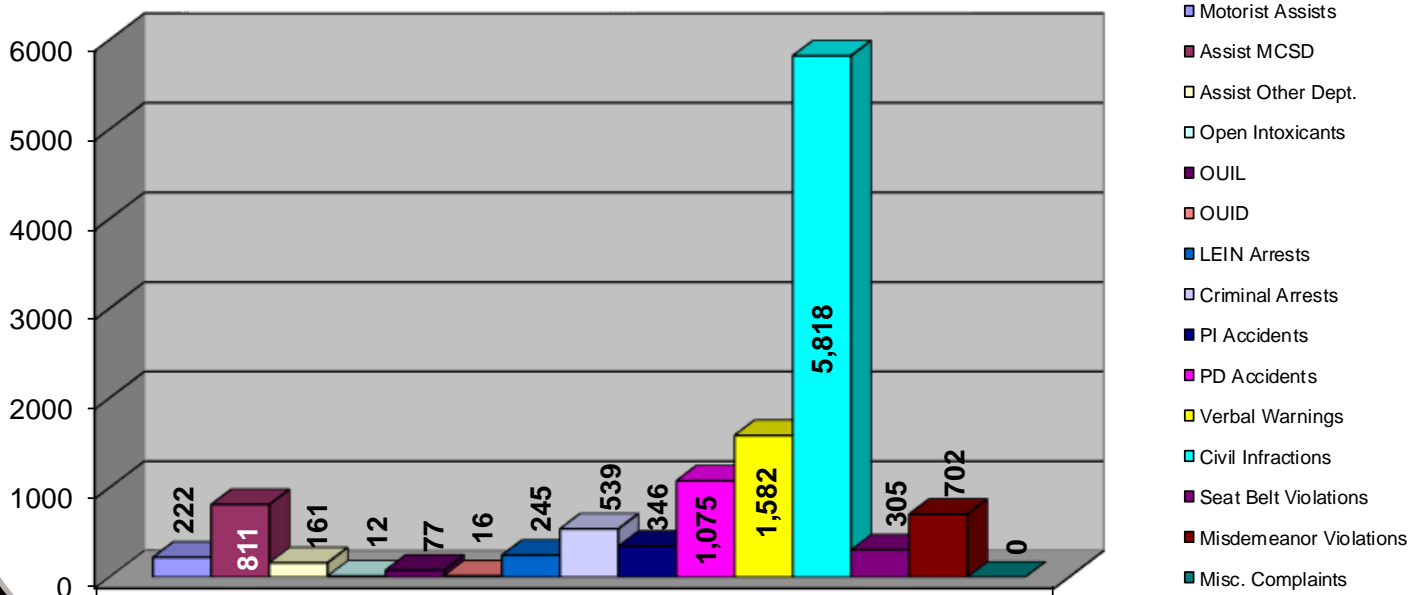
# Traffic Bureau

Special Grant Initiatives for 2016 included a \$236,000 grant from the Office of Highway Safety for multi-jurisdictional initiatives such as "Click-it or Ticket" and "Drive Sober Or Get Pulled Over" campaigns throughout the year. This funding was shared with 10 other Macomb County law enforcement agencies. The Sheriff's Office Traffic Unit Command was the Project Director for this grant.

### 2016 - Traffic Statistics



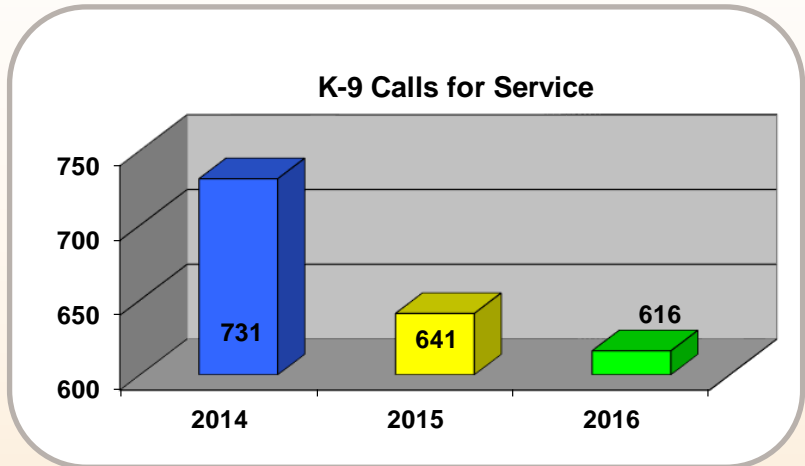
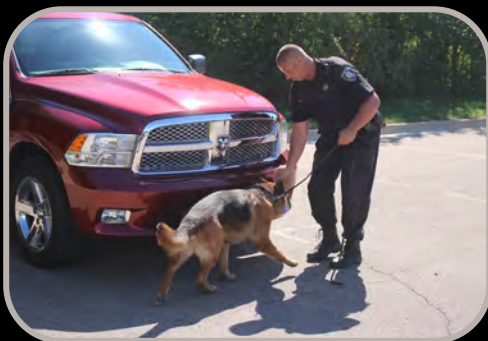

# Marine Division

The Marine Division patrols Lake St. Clair, which has been called the busiest freshwater lake in the world. Lake St. Clair covers approximately 85 square miles with 30.5 miles of shoreline connecting to 57 miles of rivers and streams.

The Sheriff's Marine Division is responsible for enforcing Michigan Marine law, investigating boat accidents, conducting livery inspections, conducting search and rescue operations, ice rescues, body recovery and instructing safe boating classes. Working with the assistance of a large number of volunteer Marine Reserve Deputies allows us to meet those responsibilities. The division also works with federal agencies to assist in Border Security.

The Marine Division instructs more people than any other agency in the state. Last year, deputies issued 5,618 Michigan Boater Safety Certificates to students.

## *Dive Team*



The Macomb County Sheriffs Underwater Search and Recovery Team was formed approximately 30 years ago. The team is tasked with the recovery of evidence and drowned persons in all 28 cities, townships and villages that comprise Macomb County. All members of the team are certified Public Safety Divers and have extensive training in underwater search and recovery methods.

The USRT also utilizes the latest technology and training to be effective in their recoveries. The use of side scan sonar, underwater remotely operated vehicles, and many other tools allow the team to achieve success in their operations. As new methods and technology come available, the team will explore and implement those procedures.

The USRT was called out several times in 2016 to recover evidence and assist other law enforcement agencies.

## COURT SECURITY

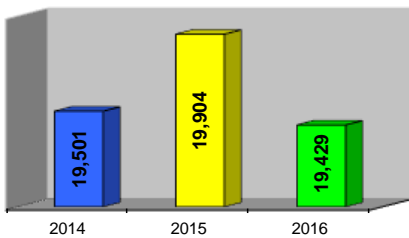
PROVIDES SECURITY FOR THE JUDGE, ATTORNEYS AND CIVILIANS IN THE COURT ROOM. THEY ENSURE THE LEGAL SYSTEM IS ALLOWED TO GO THROUGH ITS PROCESS WITHOUT DISRUPTIONS FROM DEFENDANTS AND/OR CIVILIANS ATTENDING THE TRIAL.

The Sheriff's Office is responsible for the security of the 16th Circuit Court, County Administration Building, County Building, Clemens Center (state and county probation offices), Probate and Wills/Estate Courts, Juvenile Court and Romeo District Court.

A Deputy Sheriff is assigned to each Judge for their protection, to maintain order in the courtrooms and protect victims, defendants and civilians. Each Deputy is trained in Emergency Responses such as building evacuations, bomb threats, barricaded gunman or hostage situations, first responder to an "active shooter" situation, crowd control and first aid (CPR/AED).

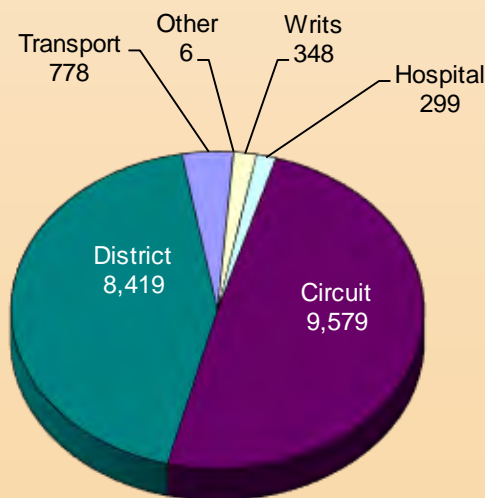

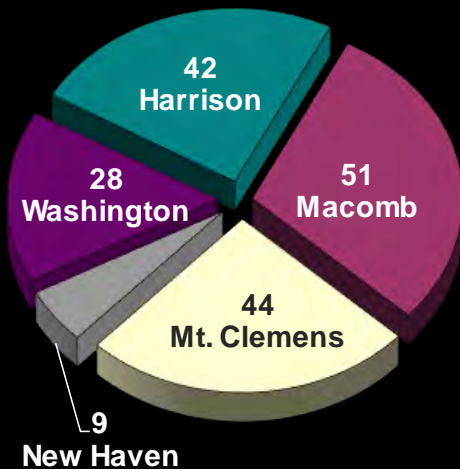
Transport Deputies also travel throughout the state to pick up court ordered inmates and individuals that have been arrested in other jurisdictions on Macomb County warrants.

Inmates are also transported for medical treatment including doctor and dentist visits. Nearly 275,000 miles were logged in 2016.

## Liquor Licenses



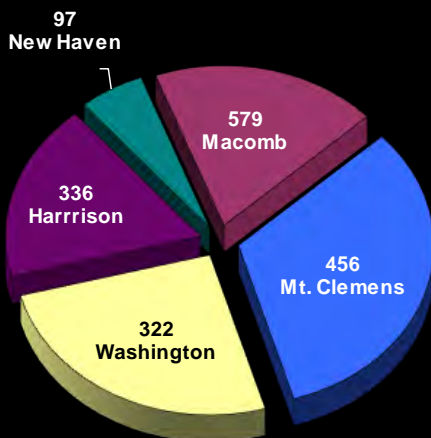
The Michigan Liquor Control Code (PA 58 of 1998) requires that the Sheriff's Office enforce the provisions of the statute and Administrative Rules promulgated under the law.

These responsibilities include liquor inspections, background checks and investigations on new liquor license applicants, as well as one-day liquor licenses for special events. Random monthly liquor inspections are conducted in our contracted areas. A total of 1,790 liquor inspections were completed in 2016.

In addition to LCC Inspections, Sheriff's Office personnel enforce the rules and regulations of the Michigan Liquor Control Commission by targeting the illegal sale and consumption of alcohol to minors.

Business establishments selling alcohol to minors are issued citations which are forwarded to the MLCC for sanctions against the licensee and business.

# Administrative Services



## Detective Bureau

### The Office of the Sheriff

The Detective Bureau conducts investigations for the Townships of Armada, Bruce, Harrison, Lenox, Macomb, Ray, Richmond and Washington; the City of Mt. Clemens and the Village of New Haven. The Bureau consists of trained detectives who investigate the full range of criminal complaints.

The Detective Bureau handled 3,650 investigations in 2016 from the beginning through the court proceedings.

The Detective Bureau also monitors Sexual Offenders Registration (SOR) for violators. In 2016, over 300 sex offenders were monitored. On a quarterly basis, deputies physically check the listed address of sex offenders in an attempt to verify their place of residence. Two benefits to this type of proactive enforcement are that it allows Sheriff's Office to verify the offender's actual place of residence and it lets the offender know that the Sheriff's Office is actively tracking their movement and may prevent future fraudulent use of addresses by sex offenders.

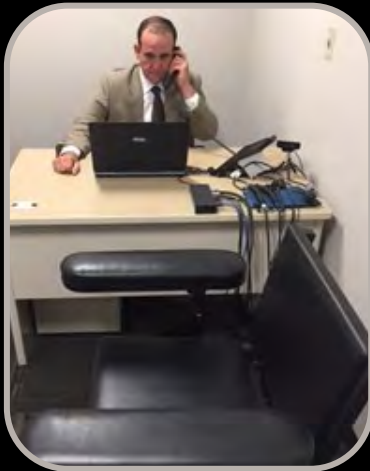
## ***Youth Bureau Services***



Youth Bureau Services personnel handle complaints and investigations involving juvenile suspects. In 2016, there were 290 investigations. This was a 51% decrease. The Youth Bureau has deputies assigned to the Drug Abuse Resistance Education (D.A.R.E.) program to teach at 14 different schools. There were approximately 1,400 D.A.R.E. graduates in 2016.

The Youth Bureau also has a deputy assigned as School Liaison Officer at Chippewa Valley School District. This deputy serves as a resource contact for school administrators, teaching staff, guidance counselors, students, social workers and parents.

## ***Polygraph***



One Deputy is assigned as a polygraph examiner to conduct polygraph examinations for the Sheriff's Office as well as other local police agency investigations. In 2016, 302 polygraphs were scheduled of which 134 were conducted. These polygraph examinations resulted in 36 that were deemed to have "deception detected" while 26 were deemed "no deception" and 5 inconclusive.

The polygraph examiner also serves as the department's liaison for Crime Stoppers and the We Tip Organization.

## ***Evidence Technicians***



Although deputies assigned as evidence technicians may assist in handling calls for service, their primary role at a crime scene is the collection, preservation and processing of evidence. Macomb County Sheriff's Office evidence technicians not only function in that capacity for the Sheriff's Office, but also assist other local law enforcement agencies as requested.



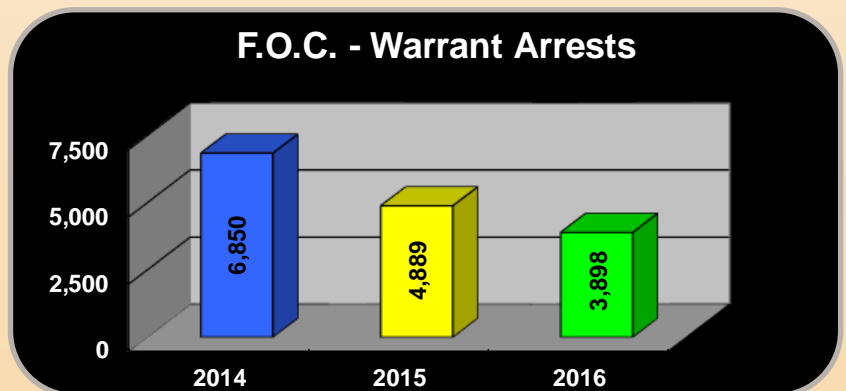
# Protective Services

The Protective Service Officers are supervised by the Sheriff's Office. The Protective Service Officers are part-time officers responsible for the security of county buildings and work with the deputies to enhance visitor safety.



# Friend of the Court (F.O.C.)

The Friend of the Court (F.O.C.) team is a specialized unit directed to locate and arrest individuals that do not comply with court orders (warrants) pertaining to Family Court issues. In 2016, FOC Deputies arrested 3,898 individuals and the year's warrant arrearages amounted to \$24,637,604.



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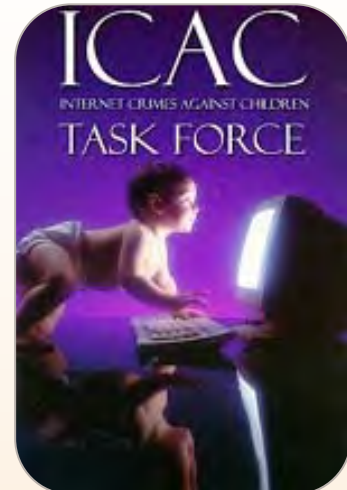
# Macomb Area Computer Enforcement (M.A.C.E.)

The Macomb Area Computer Enforcement unit (M.A.C.E.) is a computer crime task force assigned to investigate computer crimes such as computer fraud, identity theft, and child sexual exploitations. This year, the unit opened approx. 780 cases and arrested 81 subjects for various criminal activities.

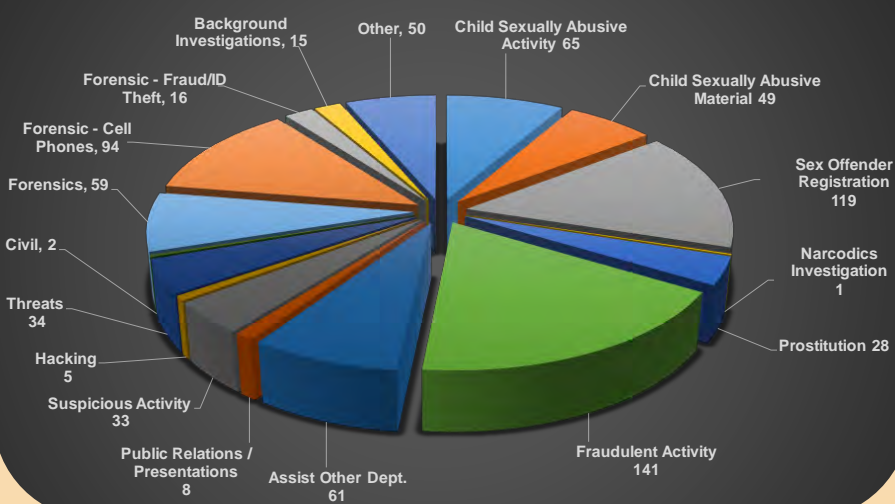
M.A.C.E. maintains partnerships with Michigan ICAC (Internet Crimes Against Children), FBI & UASI Region 2 Cyber Security.

Computer crimes are often difficult to investigate do to crossing jurisdictional lines, as well as the increase in communication technology available: such as smart phones and on-line games through which children are solicited. M.A.C.E investigators assist other local law enforcement agencies with computer crime investigations.

M.A.C.E. continues to assist with education and prevention endeavors in local schools educating all grade levels of students, teachers and parents regarding cyber crime and safe use of the Internet.

# Sheriff Enforcement Team (S.E.T.)

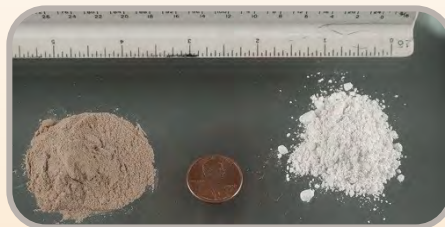


The Sheriff's Enforcement Team (S.E.T.) investigates drug cases, vice cases, and major crimes. The team provides investigative and surveillance assistance to local, state, and federal agencies. The team also searches for fugitives.

In 2016, 598 cases were opened resulting in 302 arrests and \$846,445 worth of illegal drugs taken off of the streets of our communities.

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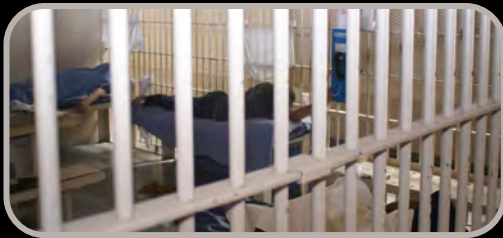


# Drug Enforcement Agency (D.E.A.)



The Sheriff's Office continues to assign personnel to the Drug Enforcement Agency (D.E.A.) teams to investigate large scale drug traffickers which has resulted in taking millions of dollars of illegal narcotics off of the streets in our communities.

# Fugitive Apprehension



Parole absconders, as well as those individuals with warrants for violent crimes, were targeted for arrest. In 2016, 312 such arrests were made. The United States Marshall's Office has provided some funding toward this in the form of a vehicle and funds for gasoline.

# County of Macomb Enforcement Team (C.O.M.E.T.)



Sheriff's Office personnel are assigned to the County of Macomb Enforcement Team (C.O.M.E.T.), a multi-jurisdictional task force whose objective is to conduct drug investigations that cross jurisdictional boundaries. C.O.M.E.T provides assistance to agencies in major crime investigations. In 2016, C.O.M.E.T initiated 115 investigations and 56 arrests.



# Macomb Auto Theft Squad (M.A.T.S.)



The Macomb Auto Theft Squad (M.A.T.S.) is a multi-jurisdictional unit comprised of investigators from the Macomb County Sheriff's Office, Clinton Township Police Department, St. Clair Shores Police Department, Sterling Heights Police Department, and the Warren Police Department. The Macomb Auto Theft Squad investigates auto theft and its related crimes including insurance fraud. M.A.T.S. is partially funded by the Michigan Automobile Theft Prevention Authority (ATPA).

In 2016, M.A.T.S. initiated 616 investigations and made 167 arrests. They recovered 126 stolen vehicles with a value of \$2,349,475.

# Special Weapons and Tactics (S.W.A.T.)

The Macomb County Special Weapons and Tactics (S.W.A.T.) Team is a multi-jurisdictional response unit which provides tactical support to any agency requesting assistance with high-risk situations. The S.W.A.T. Team is available to render a high level of expertise in diffusing potentially dangerous or hostile situations. In situations where it is appropriate, Crisis Negotiators respond and work with the S.W.A.T. Team.

The team also includes a doctor from Henry Ford Hospitals and three tactical medics from MedStar to provide immediate treatment for wounded officers or victims at the scene of an incident.

# Training Division



The Training Division is responsible for facilitating all training at the Macomb County Sheriff's Office. Both in-service and advanced training at various locations are provided.

The level of training ranges from new employee orientation to advanced training that would be available to specialized units such as investigations, tactical units and high-tech units. The areas of training provided by the Training Division include all employee classifications such as law enforcement, corrections, dispatchers, and clerical.



For in-service training in 2016, thirteen training days were conducted for all 3 shifts. The Training Division accounted for over 8,000 hours of corrections training for command, deputies, and corrections deputies for compliance with the MSCTC training requirements in the State of Michigan. Total agency training of all personnel was 34,570 hours.

Sheriff's Dispatchers received an additional 3,126 hours of training facilitated by the training division.

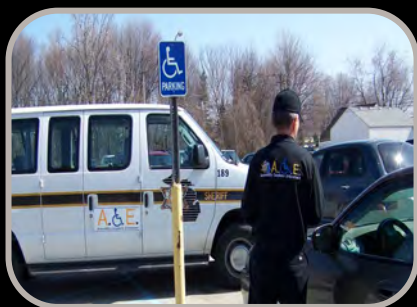
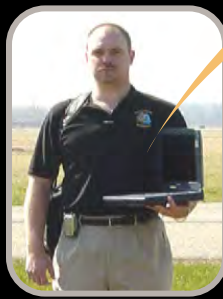
# Firearms Training Division



The Firearms Division of the Sheriff's Office provides training in lethal and less lethal force options such as Electronic Control Weapons and Chemical Agents. Following guidelines from court decisions, officers are trained using Realistic Based Training (RBT), which duplicates situations that the deputy may encounter while on duty. It is not merely qualification but training that will prepare them to respond properly.

# Reserve Units



Community involvement is one of the key missions of the Sheriff's Office, and that is no more evident than with the Reserve Units. There are eight distinct units: A.C.E., ATV, Aviation, Cyber Crimes, Marine, Mountain Bike, Mounted, and Motorcycle. Members of each unit volunteer their time and their own equipment to assist the Sheriff's Office. Two other volunteer groups who donate their time to serve the citizens of Macomb County are Senior Volunteers and Explorers.

The 25,877 hours the reserves and volunteers donated in 2016 is equivalent to \$738,788 in funding for the county.

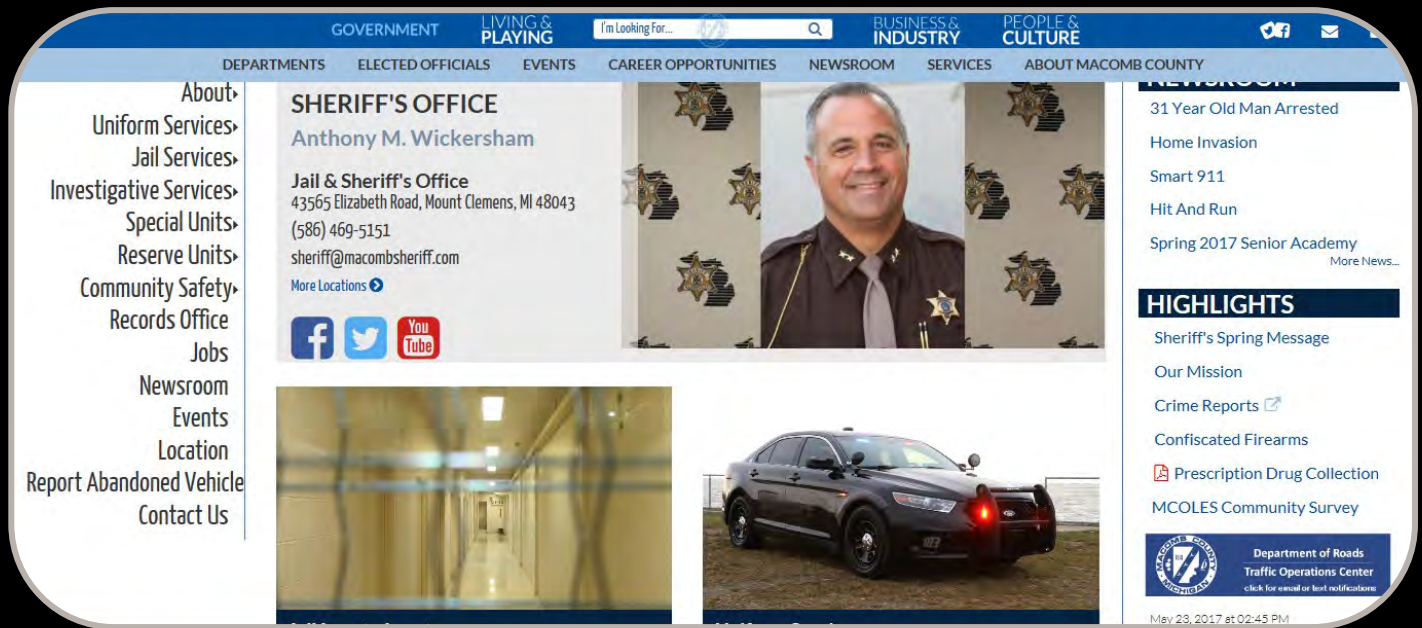

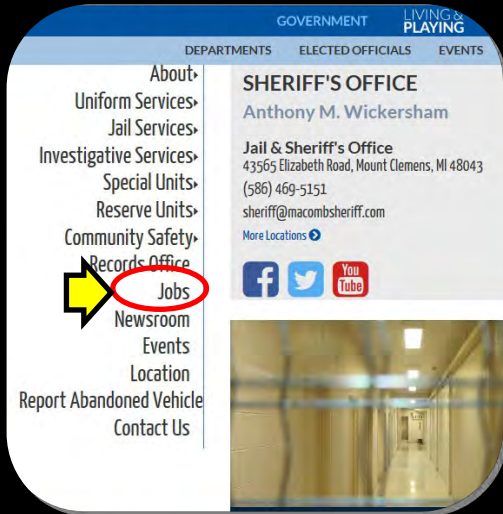
