

Mr. Bednar updated the Board that the SAW Grant project is closed. There is a recommendation for a more frequent maintenance and inspection plan for the syphon. There is also need to plan for future failures of the system due to age. Our plan is to incorporate all of the SAW findings into a more comprehensive operation maintenance plan and integrate it into our NEXGEN asset management system.

Mr. Bednar also updated the Board regarding past conversations on the consolidation of the various related drains. A recommendation has come to us regarding an engineering contractor that we could use to complete the project. A proposal will be put together to present to the board.

Mr. Bednar updated the Board on new business regarding the I-696 green ooze. They have begun cleanup of the chemicals found on site and have established another pumping station on I-696 along with a trench along the service drive. They found it could impact our drains due to the chemicals flowing from the North/Northeast and getting in the pipe itself from the trench and entering our Sharkey Drain. Testing has shown no issue for the residents in the area. They will soon test the service drive storm sewer to determine if there is chemical in there and where it could travel. Bear Creek samples have come back less than drinking water standard.

A motion was made by Mr. Baker, supported by Mr. Nash to authorize Macomb County Public Works to engage ECT for testing services at a not to exceed cost of \$5,000.
