

The Chairman called the meeting to order at 10:02 a.m.

A motion was made by Mr. Suma, supported by Mr. Nash to approve the agenda as presented.

Mr. Dugger thanked the Board for working with Clinton Township in their grant application to the state for the purchase of the Sheffield property and for mowing the grass. He is concerned about the whips that were planted north of 16 Mile Road, west of Ballard that did not take. Mr. Bednar stated that additional 2-inch trees will be planted to replace the whips. A group of kayakers did a clean-up along the Spillway, with GFL removing the trash. Mr. Dugger asked that the Macomb County Department of Roads (MCDoR) be asked to treat the phragmites in the road ditches to prevent them from spreading to the recently treated Spillway. Mr. Bednar stated that the Spillway will be treated once more under the grant and the MCDoR will treat the ditches in the fall.

The minutes of the meeting of June 27, 2018 were presented. A motion was made by Mr. Nash, supported by Mr. Suma to approve the minutes as presented.

A meeting was held with NOAA, Hubbell, Roth & Clark, Inc. (HRC) and the Macomb County Public Works Office (MCPWO) to discuss closing out the grant. A meeting will be held next week to discuss use of the remaining funds. NOAA does not support additional aquatic

plantings. There is a two-year maintenance agreement on the plantings. Shrubs and trees will be planted where the snow fence is currently located. The Coastal Zone Management (MDNR/MDEQ) is interested in helping with future improvements along the Spillway by providing grants.

A motion was made by Mr. Suma, supported by Mr. Nash to receive and file the project update given by Mr. Bednar.

Re: Spillway Master Plan Update

Dear fellow Clinton River Spillway Inter County Drainage Board members,

As the Great Lakes Restoration Initiative project wraps up later this fall on the Clinton River Spillway, I have heard from many residents and local leaders who are very pleased with what has been accomplished there. I believe that we are all in agreement that the GLRI project was a huge success. It has greatly improved wildlife habitat in an urban/suburban setting, helped reduce the sediment load deposited in to Lake St. Clair and created a new destination for local fishermen with the pier where the Spillway crosses Harper.

With this major success now complete, I believe it is a good time to take a look at the Spillway with fresh eyes. The Spillway is an engineering marvel that has served our communities for more than 60 years. We have an incredible opportunity now to capitalize on the current level of enthusiasm for what has been accomplished. As we have looked at ways to reduce our ongoing seasonal maintenance costs for grass mowing, various ideas have been presented about selling excess property or to use the excess property in a way that benefits the public but reduces the annual cost burden on the Spillway Authority.

The hike/bike path and new fishing pier along the southern edge of the Spillway demonstrate the appetitive and need for additional recreational opportunities in the area. The staging area on the northern bank of the Spillway's mouth is an example of an opportunity waiting for a solution.

I believe the Spillway Authority should convene a planning group to explore ways that the Spillway can be better utilized to serve the public. There may be additional grant dollars available. It may be possible that money the Authority now spends on mowing the grass could be re-directed in a way that better invests in the Spillway's operations.

With your support, I recommend the establishment of a committee comprised of planners and governmental leaders from Macomb County's Dept. of Planning & Economic Development, Clinton and Harrison townships and Mount Clemens. The Macomb County Public Works Office is happy to represent this Authority's interests on the committee and welcomes any other board members to participate. This committee's assignment would be to develop a master plan for use of the Spillway property in a way that provides maximum benefit to the public while



remaining cost-neutral to the Spillway Authority. I am eager to collect both your input and your support for this effort.

I look forward to discussing this proposal at our August 22, 2018 meeting. Sincerely,
