

A meeting of the Inter-County Drainage Board for the **BEAR CREEK DRAIN** was held in the Office of the Macomb County Public Works Commissioner, 21777 Dunham Road, Clinton Township, Michigan on September 27, 2017.

The Chairman called the meeting to order at 10:23 a.m.

A motion was made by Ms. Miller, supported by Ms. Vaara and unanimously carried to approve the agenda as presented.

The minutes of the meeting of August 23, 2017 were presented. A motion was made by Ms. Miller, supported by Ms. Vaara and unanimously carried to approve the minutes as presented.

The Chairman presented the invoices totaling \$9,221.98 as provided to the board for review and approval.

Motion was made by Ms. Miller, supported by Ms. Vaara to approve the invoices as presented.

AYES: Miller, Vaara and Gregg

NAYS: None Motion approved.

Ms. Kanan, AEW updated the board on the district delineation project. The metes and bounds, property descriptions and documents are being compiled to map out the actual drainage district. The goal is for AEW and Fahey, Schultz, Burzych, Rhodes, PLC to present their findings at the next board meeting.

Green infrastructure is on-hold until the district delineation portion of the project is complete. Until it is determined what communities are in the drainage district, discussions on green infrastructure cannot be held. Communities would be asked to incorporate green infrastructure into new developments or redevelopments.

The original scope of work for the SAW Grant was strictly for the enclosed portion of the drain. Construction costs for needed improvements sited in the SAW Grant summary are upwards of \$755,800. These improvements were then prioritized based on criticality for a cost of \$588,000. An in-depth IDEP was done approximately 10 years ago. It was suggested entering this data into GIS and building on past information. ECT performed the prior water sample testing so it was suggested having them work with AEW. Capacity will not increase with the repairs to the drainage system, but will bring the drain back to its original design capacity. Mr. Bednar will work with AEW on an IDEP cost and ideas for partnering with Warren and GM to increase drain flow capacity and present same to board.

A corrugated metal pipe (CMP) in the open drain has failed just before it discharges into the Red Run Drain and a sinkhole has formed. AEW prepared an estimate of cost to repair this portion of pipe with concrete and repair the manhole for \$22,000.00. This repair could be incorporated into the overall project cost.

A motion to incorporate the CMP repair into the overall repair project and authorize AEW to seek bids on the CMP repair and bring back to the board for approval was made by Ms. Miller, supported by Ms. Vaara and unanimously approved.

A resident lodged a complaint about a sinkhole in his backyard. The pipe connecting the catch basin to the Bear Creek Drain is in good condition, but the area under the catch basin has been undermined causing the sediment to leach into the drain. AEW will inspect manholes upstream of this site where the laterals tap the Bear Creek Drain to see if there are other failures.

A motion to receive and file the Anderson, Eckstein & Westrick, Inc. progress report was made by Ms. Vaara, supported by Ms. Miller.

AYES: Vaara, Miller, Gregg

NAYS: None Motion approved.

The sinkhole repair on the GM property should be completed by the end of the week. The concrete wash will be repaired next.

A motion to receive and file the sinkhole and concrete wash report given by Mr. Stockel was made by Ms. Vaara, supported by Ms. Miller and unanimously approved.

There may be homeowners on Cunningham Street that are interested in taking a portion of the Bear Creek vacant land located on Marcy Street. The City of Warren is not interested in taking possession of this property. Letters will be sent to all homeowners asking about interest in the property. The property will remain as a drain easement. Homeowners will not be allowed to build permanent structures on the land.

A motion to send letters to homeowners offering the option to take ownership of the land and bring back the responses to the board was made by Ms. Miller, supported by Ms. Vaara and unanimously approved.

A motion to receive and file the financial report given by Mr. Baker was made by Ms. Miller, supported by Ms. Vaara and unanimously approved.

There being no further business coming before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 11:40 a.m. by Mr. Gregg on a motion by Ms. Vaara, supported by Ms. Miller and unanimously approved.
