The meeting was called to order by the Chair, Candice S. Miller. A motion was made by Ms. Lucido, supported by Mr. Santo to approve the agenda as presented.

Minutes of the meeting of December 12, 2022 were presented. A motion was made by Mr. Santo, supported by Ms. Lucido to approve the minutes as presented.

The meeting was opened to public participation, then closed, there being no comments from the public.

Mr. Astorino updated that there were no wet weather events this month. The Chapaton In-System Storage project is the only active construction project currently. They are making good progress. They have started to expose the shaft and are welding up the lower support steel around the structure. Thick clay and a lot of rain lately is making it difficult. It is a 50 foot wide by 75 foot long shaft and is going down approximately 35 feet deep. As of now, everything is on schedule.

As with Martin, we completed a 2022 Eight and One Half Summary. We had one wet weather event during 2022 which is the lowest number of treated events in more than 20 years. As we add more projects to reduce overflows, that number will be even better.

A motion was made by Mr. Santo supported by Ms. Lucido to receive and file project updates.

Mr. Astorino presented the 9 Mile Emergency Bypass Rehabilitation engineering project recommendation. Back in the 1920's when the 9 Mile drain was built, all the sewage went directly out

into the lake. There was no wastewater treatment. Since that time, this box culvert still exists and the overflow is sent to the bypass. This asset was most recently inspected in 2016 but given the uncertainty of whether this pipe would remain, repairs were not immediately made as it was thought to be incorporated into other upcoming projects. Mr. Astorino presented some pictures of the pipe and showed the condition it is in and the need for repair. MCPWO reached out to FKE and NTH for quotes which NTH Consultants came in with a lower cost.

A motion was made by Ms. Lucido supported by Mr. Santo to approve the proposal from NTH Consultants, Ltd. for a not to exceed amount of \$118,578 for inspection, planning, and contract administration services for the 9 Mile Emergency Bypass Rehabilitation project.

Mr. Downing presented on the Construction Project Safety Manager. After conducting a safety review of our active construction projects and our upcoming projects that will start this year, Mr. Downing felt that our office would benefit from the addition of a Safety Manager. He asked Meadowbrook Insurance Agency to research and recommend a qualified candidate on a temporary basis. He is recommending that this individual be a sub-consultant of Meadowbrook Insurance to help provide safety oversight with portions of time spilt 75% MID and 25% 8 ½ Relief for a nine month period at an hourly rate of \$97.00 per hour in accordance with the terms outlined in the MIA Contract Amendment No. 2. Mr. Santo questioned that if we are paying the insurance premium, and the contractor is paying the deductible if a safety issue should arise, should there be buy-in from the contractor. Mr. Downing said that it is just his recommendation, it is the Board's discretion to proceed with the recommendation. Mr. Santo asked if mileage was included in the hourly rate of \$97.00. Ms. Lucido said that she would support it because it shows intent to take every safety precaution. Mr. Santo said that if it can be worked out the hourly rate is all-inclusive of costs, then he will support it. Mr. Downing said that he will work with the legal department on the terms of the agreement.

A motion was made by Ms. Lucido, supported by Mr. Santo to approve the proposal from Meadowbrook Insurance for the addition of a temporary Construction Project Safety Manager for a 9-month period with a cost of \$97 per hour (all costs included), 40 hour work week position, for an estimated total of \$34,920 for the 8.5 Mile Relief Drain.

The following provides a status update for construction work completed within the 8 ½ Mile Relief Drain Drainage District (8MRDDD) for the previous month.

## **Wet Weather Operations**

No wet weather events this past month.

# Chapaton In-System Storage Project

**Contractor:** Weiss Construction

Engineering Consultant: Tetra Tech

#### Project Description:

The primary focus of the project is the construction of an access shaft and installation of the In-System Storage Device at Beaconsfield and Oak in Eastpointe. This project will achieve an additional 3.5 million gallons of storage within the 8.5 Mile Relief tunnel.

#### Significant project tasks that have occurred over the past month:

- 1. Submittals are being received and processed by the engineering team.
- 2. Construction activities per Update Period:
  - Continued staging construction materials delivered & stored along Beaconsfield greenbelt.
  - Maintained secured work site with swing gates and privacy fence screening at construction sites.

- Continued Beaconsfield site vibration and sensor monitoring and documentation during and shaft construction as required.
- Continued excavating interior of shaft approximately *30-ft* below grade.
- Continued to load out excavated spoils off site as planned.
- Exposed top, north and south sides of 11.5ft tunnel to spring line elevation within the excavation shaft at the Beaconsfield site.
- Completed installing and welding the lower-tier steel shaft bracing inside the Beaconsfield shaft construction site as designed.
- Continued installing timber lagging retaining walls around the interior of Beaconsfield shaft as required.
- Continued applying flow fill grout to fill voids behind timber lagging from over-excavation as required.
- Proposed control building transformer set in place on concrete pad as required.
- Temporary power skid installed and energized with DTE meter in place as required.

#### 3. Construction look ahead:

- Continue deliveries of construction materials along Beaconsfield greenbelt.
- Continue Beaconsfield site vibration monitoring & documentation.
- Ongoing excavation surrounding the exposed 11.5ft tunnel at Beaconsfield and remove spoils offsite as planned.
- Continue to install shaft interior timber lagging retaining walls as required.
- Place flow fill grout to fill voids behind shaft lagging and seal timber walls as necessary.
- Start excavation process to undermine existing 11.5ft tunnel in proposed design sequence as required.
- Install cribbing and supports to existing 11.5ft tunnel during undermining of existing tunnel as required.
- Place low strength concrete mud-mat and high strength mass concrete under-side of existing 11.5ft tunnel in proposed design sequence as required.

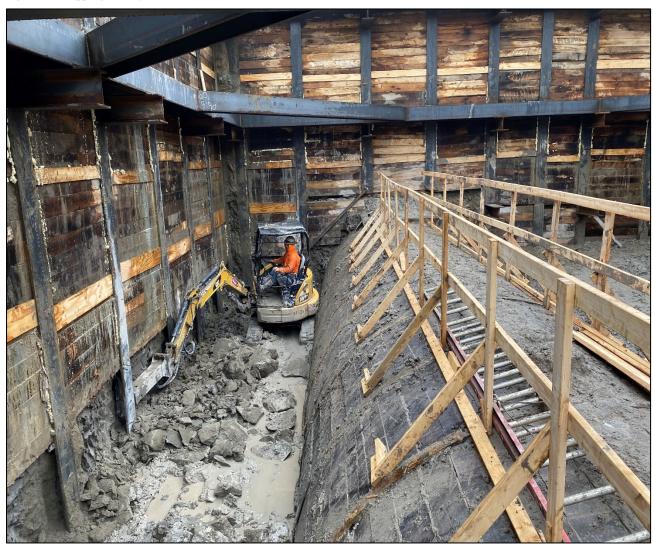


Figure 2 – Pumping Grout to fill Voids

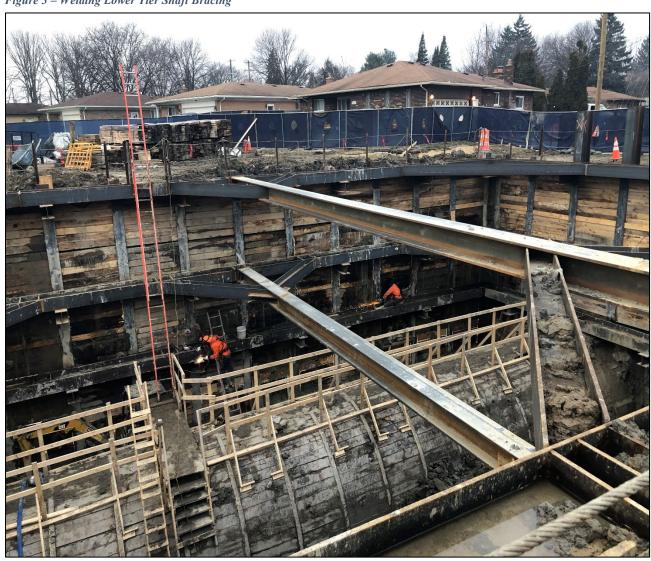


Figure 4 – Excavated Approx. 25FT Facing West

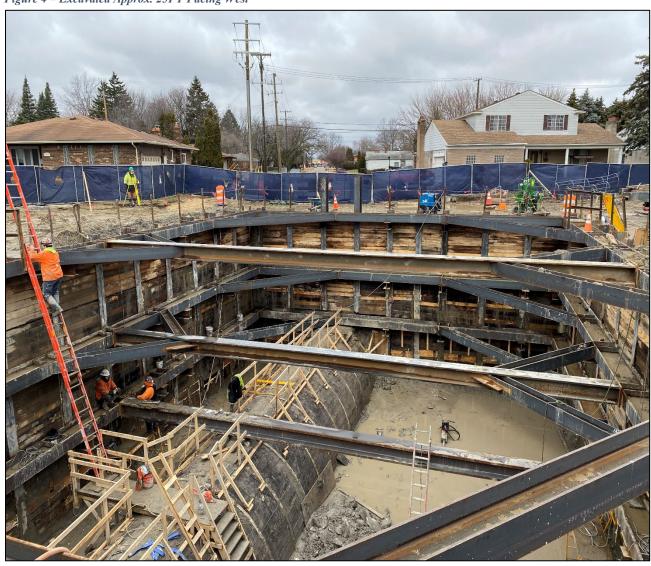


Figure 5 – Excavated Approx. 30FT Facing East

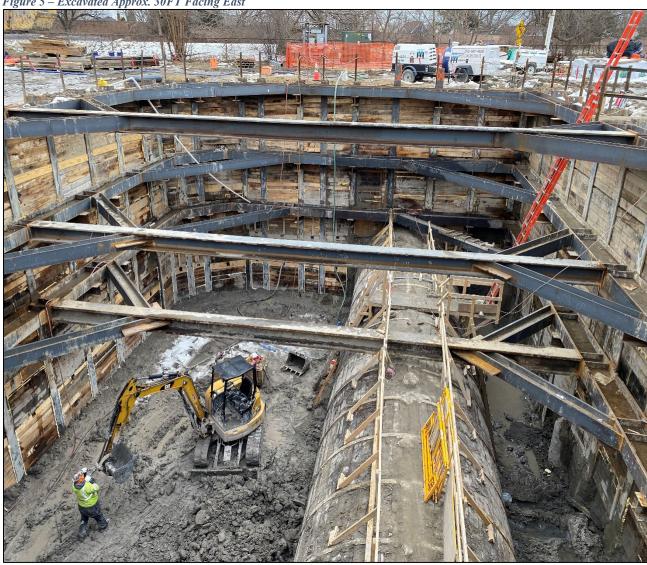


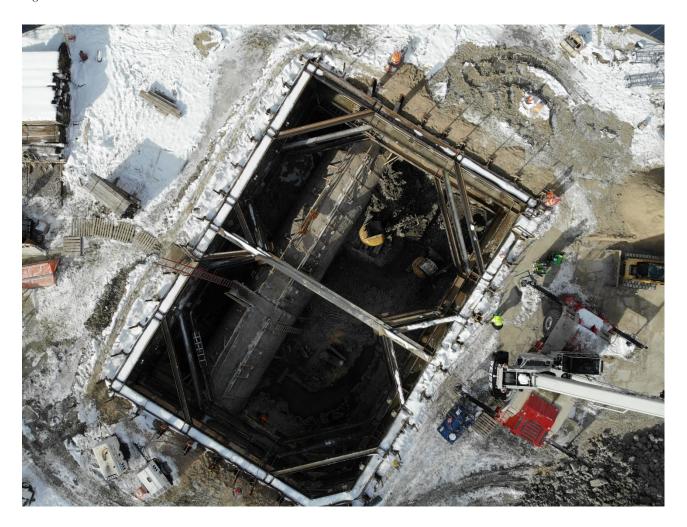
Figure 6 – DTE Energizing Transformer
