Man Arraigned on 14 Charges in Connection with Armed Robbery

Mount Clemens, MI - On Friday, May 19, 2023, 32 year old Jasper Listenbee of Eastpointe, was arraigned in connection with carjacking and thirteen other charges.

It is alleged that on Friday, May 19, 2023 Jasper Listenbee, armed with a firearm, approached a man who was sitting in his vehicle in front of his family's home. The victim said the keys to the vehicle were inside the home. Listenbee stole his phone and money. Listenbee ordered the victim inside the home at gunpoint. Once in the home he ordered the other occupants to find the keys and pointed his gun at them. The Warren Police Department arrived and arrested Listenbee.

Listenbee is charged with Armed Robbery (life felony), Carjacking (life felony), First Degree Home Invasion (20 year felony), Felon in Possession of a Firearm (five-year felony), three counts of Felonious Assault (four-year felony), and seven counts of Felony Firearm (a mandatory two-year prison sentence.)

Listenbee was arraigned on Friday, May 19, 2023 in Warren 37th District Court by Judge Michael Chupa. Judge Chupa set bond at \$600,000.00 cash/surety. The probable cause hearing is scheduled for June 1, 2023 at 9:30 am and the preliminary exam is scheduled for June 8, 2023 at 9:30 am in Warren District Court.

"The array of charges highlight the dangerous nature of the alleged incident and the threat to the safety and well-being of our community. We will collaborate closely with law enforcement to ensure that the defendant faces the consequences of his alleged actions. We will pursue and seek justice for the victims," said Macomb County Prosecutor Peter J. Lucido
