## Three Women Arraigned for Criminal Enterprise and ID Theft

Mount Clemens, MI - Three women were charged and arraigned for conducting a criminal enterprise and for identity theft in Warren.

It is alleged that September 2022 through March 2023, 25 year-old Breanna Johnson, 32 year-old Samantha Parker, and 51 year-old Danielle Courtney illegally obtained personal identifying information on multiple victims to gain money, goods, and services. The total amount stolen is undetermined at this time. All three defendants have been charged with Conducting Criminal Enterprises (20 year felony), and Identity Theft (five year felony).

Breanna Johnson of Harrison, MI was arraigned on Wednesday, April 12, 2023 in front of Warren District Court Judge Suzanne Faunce where bond was set at \$10,000.00 cash/surety only.

Samantha Parker of Westland, MI was arraigned on Thursday, February 23, 2023 in front of Warren District Court Chief Judge John Chmura where bond was set at \$5,000.00 cash/surety only.

Danielle Courtney of Westland, MI was arraigned on Wednesday, May 31, 2023 in front of Warren District Court Judge Suzanne Faunce where bond was set at \$100,000.00 cash/surety only.

"Thank you to the Warren Police Department for helping unveil the harsh reality of a criminal enterprise fueled by deception and identity theft. It is the Macomb County Prosecutor's Office's duty to safeguard the integrity of our society and shield the community from these illicit operations. We will tirelessly advocate for truth, accountability, and restitution," said Macomb County Prosecutor Peter J. Lucido.
