

The meeting was opened to public participation, then closed, there being no comments from the public.

Mr. Downing stated that MCPWO was alerted to a failure in the Lorraine Drain. A connecting portion of the corrugated metal pipe had failed. We received proposals from 3 different vendors. Robert Clancy, L.J. Construction, and Cortis Brothers. We checked the fund balance of the Lorraine Drain and coordinated with the City of Warren for match funding toward the repair. Upon excavation, it was discovered that the drain was deeper than on the as-builts, and the condition proved more difficult for repair, adding additional cost to the repair. The drain had a balance of \$9,346, the City of Warren funded \$8,162.50, and MCPWO added \$7,896.50 from the Administration funds for the total of \$25,405.

Ms. Xiong asked when the work was done. Mr. Downing stated that it was done in August. We wanted it complete before school started as it was close to a ball field.

A motion was made by Ms. Xiong, supported by Mr. Santo to approve Robert Clancy Contracting, Inc. for the repairs and inspection for the total amount of \$25,405.00.

Subject: Inspection of the Drain Under I-696

The Lorraine Storm Drain is an enclosed stormwater drain constructed in the early 1960's that runs along Lorraine Avenue in the City of Warren. The Drain consists of a 132-inch diameter RCP section that crosses beneath the I-696 expressway, see attached map for reference. The MCPWO has determined that an inspection of this Drain is due, specifically as it relates to the location, a failure of this drain in this location would have severe impacts to I-696. The drain has not been inspected since it was constructed based on records available to MCPWO staff.

The increase of funding for the County's Drain Match Program in 2023 has allowed the MCPWO to expand the program to include enclosed stormwater drains. MCPWO evaluated areas critical in nature that should be inspected. This inspection is selected for the Macomb County Drain Match Program. Discussions with the City of Warren Engineering Department to allocate City funds toward this inspection are ongoing. The MCPWO decided to move forward with the inspection utilizing existing drain funds and County Drain Match funds. Depending on the results if the inspection, future funds allocated by the City will either be applied to adjust this inspection or toward repairs or sediment removal identified during the inspection.

A team consisting of AEW and Doetsch Environmental Services was selected to provide the services required to facilitate an inspection of this section of the drain. The inspection, oversight and final reporting is estimated to cost \$58,514, cost summary is attached for reference.

The recommendation is that the Lorraine Storm Drain Drainage District Board approve the Inspection for the total not-to-exceed cost of \$58,514 to AEW and Doetsch Environmental Services.
