Administrative Order 1985-1 re: Internal Court Management, when dealing with no progress matters, provided the following:

Publication. At least ten (10) days prior to the first Monday of July and December, the County Clerk shall cause the complete No Progress Calendar to be published in one issue of the Macomb County Legal News in a separate section clearly entitled "Causes in which no progress has been made for one year," together with a notice that "said causes will be dismissed ten (10) days after the first Monday of July or December unless stricken from the said No Progress Calendar by court order upon good cause shown."

Notice by Mail. At least one (1) week prior to said publication, each attorney or party, if unrepresented, listed in said No Progress Calendar shall be mailed written notice that the cause listed will be dismissed and giving the date that said No Progress Calendar is going to be published.

Dismissal. All cases listed on this No Progress Calendar shall be dismissed ten (10) days after the first Monday of July or December by written order entered in each case by the assigned Judge, unless unrepresented parties or attorneys of record in said case shall take the following steps before the tenth day of the term:

- (1) In a no contest action, default is taken and a motion for judgment is filed; or
- (2) Notice a motion before the assigned Judge with an affidavit setting forth:

- (a) The reason for the lack of progress.
- (b) A statement that the case has not been theretofore on the No Progress Calendar, or, if previously removed from such calendar, the number of times and the dates of each removal.

Reinstatement. After the entry of such order of dismissal for want of progress, any application for reinstatement must be noticed for hearing before the assigned Judge.

Michigan Court Rule 2.502 entitled Dismissal for Lack of Progress as modified will be effective October 1, 1991. To closer align the 16th Judicial Circuit with the Michigan Court Rules, it is hereby ordered that the above-cited section of Administrative Order 1985-1 is rescinded effective October 1, 1991. On that date provisions of Michigan Court Rule 2.502 shall be followed by the 16th Judicial Circuit.
