The meeting was opened to public participation, then closed, there being no comments from the public.

Mr. Astorino stated that he was happy to announce that Chapaton used all of their storage and did not have a discharge last month during the wet weather event. We were the only basin in the entire region that did not have a discharge. This is the fourth event since the 2021 implementation of our operational schemes that we have been able to prevent the spill. Mrs. Miller then spoke about the testing of the lakes and findings of what is in our water in regards to combined sewer overflows being discharged into the lakes. She reiterated how important it is to stop these overflows from discharging into our waterways.

Mr. Astorino continued with the Chapaton Basin and Nine Mile Drain Structural Repairs Project. It was awarded to D'Agostini last month and they are also working on the Martin Flushing Project.

We are waiting on Weiss for a schedule for the Chapaton In-System Storage Project. They have been working with DTE for the utility relocation at Beaconsfield and Oak. It now looks like they will have everything relocated by July. Weiss will start mobilizing in early April to start the ancillary sites for venting. We just received their draft schedule on Friday and are reviewing it.

The Nine Mile Pump Station is on task. The Canal Rehab is making progress with design. We are looking through the early design concepts now. The Green Infrastructure Project is also going well.

A motion was made by Mr. Santo, supported by Mrs. Klinefelt to receive and file the project updates by Mr. Astorino.

Mr. Downing then updated on the OCIP Program. He provided a memo and spoke about the significant cost savings if we were to bundle the projects together. His intention for this presentation today is to get the board's approval for Commissioner Miller to bind coverage for the cost savings. We will get the final numbers and report back to the board before Commissioner Miller signs it.

Mr. Santo asked about the bundling being about a \$700,000 savings, and it was confirmed. Mr. VanSyckel asked if we had ever collected anything on our insurance policies in the last few years. Mr. Downing confirmed on Segment 5 we had a collection. Mr. Baker mentioned a collection on OMID from the 2016 sinkhole, and we may have a collection coming up on Segment 6 per Commissioner Miller.

# Macomb public works leader urges action on contaminants, combined sewer overflows

Macomb County Public Works Commissioner Candice Miller said Monday the state should take more steps to keep contaminants from entering the Great Lakes and other waterways and address combined sewer overflows.

Miller was reacting to a joint study conducted by Wayne State University's Healthy Urban Waters program and the University of Florida reviewing water samples pulled from the corridor between Lake Huron and Lake Erie.

The Free Press reported Monday that the joint study found that antibiotics, acetaminophen, cocaine, the diabetes drug metformin, nicotine, PFAS and caffeine were detected in water samples.

Miller said many pesticides, pharmaceuticals and other compounds can enter the waterways through storm water runoff during major rain events leading to combined sewer overflows, including from Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties.

"This study shows why it is so important for all of us to take the issue of combined sewer overflows much more seriously. Just because the State of Michigan permits this activity doesn't make it OK," Miller said. "This study is a wakeup call for communities to separate their combined systems, and or build bigger retention basins. We can't just keep passing this issue on to future generations when what we're doing is negatively impacting our drinking water."

Several compounds, such as prescription drugs, are not fully broken down by humans and are secreted in their waste. In areas where sanitary sewers are not separate from storm sewers, the combined flow including runoff of pesticides and fertilizers from agricultural areas, and chemicals from industrial sites, reducing CSO's helps.

Miller's office said the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy in 2020 rejected a county request to increase the storage capacity at the Chapaton Retention Treatment Basin on Nine Mile Road in St. Clair Shores.

The plan, which involved expanding the storage canal linking the underground storage basin to Lake St. Clair, would have reduced combine sewer overflows by up to 70%, representatives said.

Last year, Miller noted a detailed assessment of the decades-old Chapaton pumps was launched after summer rainstorms strained the facility.

In 2021, Chapaton and the Martin Drain Retention Treatment discharged 411 million gallons and 405 million gallons of treated combined sewer overflows into Lake St. Clair, the Public Works office reported.

Macomb County Public Works engineers continue to design and develop projects to help reduce the overflows, Miller's office said.

"Every little bit of reduction helps," Miller said. "Water quality equals quality of life, and the problem of CSO's — and even the occasional discharge of raw, untreated sewage that has occurred in other counties in violation of discharge permits — is not something that should just be passed along to future generations to solve."

# Water samples show nicotine, cocaine, antibiotics in Great Lakes waterways

Artificial sweeteners, pharmaceuticals, pesticides and nonstick compounds were found in multiple water samples in the corridor between Lake Huron and Lake Erie, including the Detroit River and Lake St. Clair, a new study found.

Drugs detected in the water included nicotine, cocaine, antibiotics, acetaminophen pain reliever, the diabetes drug metformin, even contrast dye from CT scans, the study by Wayne State University's Healthy Urban Waters program and the University of Florida found. They're found in very minute concentrations, down to the parts per trillion.

Known as contaminants of emerging concern, many are only detectable now because of advancements in the sensitivity of laboratory technology. While some of the detected chemicals are known to cause public health or environmental harm, for the majority, it remains unstudied and unknown.

"I wanted to look in a real-world environment to see what was out there, what we should be concerned about," said Tracie Baker, an environmental toxicologist at the University of Florida and adjunct professor at Wayne State University.

"There was a lot of research in the past 50 years — since the Rouge River caught on fire — that's focused on legacy contaminants like heavy metals, dioxins, PCBs. What my group was interested in doing was looking more specifically at some of the emerging contaminants that we don't necessarily think about as toxic; that people aren't really looking for in our rivers and lakes."

Water samples were collected in the spring and fall of both 2018 and 2019 at six sites:

The mouth of the Clinton River; Lake St. Clair Metropark Northeast Belle Isle
Southwest Belle Isle
The mouth of the Rouge River near Zug Island
The Detroit River International Wildlife Refuge/Trenton Channel.

"We wanted them to be places where people were going, places of recreation," Baker said."We also wanted areas near industry, drinking water intakes, and wastewater effluent."

Contaminants of emerging concern are known to enter the environment through runoff from residential, agricultural, industrial or military sites; particularly in significant rain events that lead to combined sewer overflows. Many of the compounds, such as prescription drugs, aren't fully broken down by humans, are secreted in their waste, and wastewater treatment plants aren't optimized to remove them — and there are no regulatory requirements that they be removed.

The Florida-Wayne State study, published last month in the peer-reviewed Journal of Great Lakes Research, detected and quantified 50 compounds across the six tested sites. Upstream sites showed more significant concentrations of pesticides and their breakdown products, likely arising from agricultural runoff. Pharmaceuticals and personal care products were found in higher concentrations near more populated areas, locations downstream of large wastewater treatment plant outflows.

Synthetic sweeteners accounted and sucralose were detected in the highest concentrations of any compound class, most particularly at the two most downstream testing sites.

The sweeteners are commonly seen in wastewater effluent because they are water soluble and resistant to human metabolism, Baker said.

There's not much scientific research showing the sweeteners as having a negative impact on human health or the environment, "but there's not a lot of research that's been done on it, either," she said.

Antibiotics were found consistently across sampling at the two most downstream testing sites.

"The persistence of sulfamethoxazole in aquatic environments, even at low levels, can drive antibiotic resistance with implications for human, animal and ecosystem health," the study states.

Other pharmaceuticals consistently detected across sampling included:

acetaminophen, a non-aspirin pain reliever; lidocaine, a topical local anesthetic; atenolol, a beta-blocker used to treat high blood pressure; gemfibrozil, a lipid regulator used to treat high cholesterol and triglycerides iohexol, used as a contrast dye for CT scans and similar procedures.

Though not consistently detected, the diabetic medication metformin and the anticonvulsant carbamazepine were found at multiple sites and during multiple sampling events.

The stimulant caffeine, found in coffee, tea and soft drinks, was also consistently found across sampling events near Zug Island, the study found. Previous studies have shown caffeine exposures at elevated levels create toxicity and anxiety-like behavior in a variety of species, including fish and other aquatic organisms. Research further shows the outcomes are worse for exposed animals when they are also subjected to artificial sweeteners at the same time, the study states.

Nicotine, cocaine and their breakdown products were also detected near the Zug Island site, but at relatively small concentrations and not consistently across sampling events. As nicotine is often used as an insecticide, it has the potential to impact zooplankton, the tiny aquatic organisms at the bottom of the food web upon which fish rely, the study found.

"I was surprised by the number of pharmaceuticals — antibiotics, and the contrast agent really surprised me," Baker said.

Per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances, or PFAS — the nearly ubiquitous nonstick compounds used in industry and consumer products now known as "forever chemicals" because of their resistance to breaking down in nature — were also found in the Wayne State/Florida study, at every testing site.

Two of the most well-known PFAS compounds, known as PFOS and PFOA, have been phased out of most industrial and consumer uses in the U.S. in recent years, as more is learned about their harmful health and environmental effects. They've been replaced by supposedly safer "short-chain" PFAS compounds, the name deriving from them having fewer carbon atoms. But research is now showing the short-chain PFAS compounds also persist in nature without breaking down and also harm public health.

The Wayne State-Florida study found 12 PFAS compounds, short- and long-chain, in water and sediment samples across the tested sites.

"Those are easily, by far, what we are seeing the most of," Baker said. "Because they are forever chemicals, they are just staying around for a long time. But now we are also starting to see the shorter chains, now that they are being used in production and products."

Examination of contaminants of emerging concern in our environment is important work, said Michael Murray, a biology instructor at Augusta University in Georgia and an adjunct professor in the University of Michigan's School of Environment and Sustainability, who was not involved in the Wayne State-Florida study. Murray, for more than 20 years until last fall, also served as staff scientist with the nonprofit National Wildlife Federation's Great Lakes Regional Center.

"There is definitely a lot we don't know on the human health end," he said. "But I think for a lot of chemicals, we know even less on the ecological end, fish and wildlife.

"PFAS is thousands of chemicals — potentially over 9,000 — and we really don't have even basic toxicity information on but maybe a couple of dozen or so."

Murray noted that many of the emerging contaminants are medicines and personal care products ending up in the environment through wastewater. But wastewater treatment plants weren't designed to capture them, and are under no regulatory obligation to do so.

But the region's largest wastewater treatment facility, run by the Great Lakes Water Authority, is paying some attention to contaminants of emerging concern. The authority collaborated with Baker on the study's examination of its effluent streams, and has a "rigorous industrial pre-treatment program that controls contaminants, including PFAS, directly at their source before entering waste streams," Cheryl Porter, chief operating officer for GLWA's Water and Field Services, said in a statement to the Free Press.

The agency also conducts occasional "unregulated contaminant monitoring sampling events," including a recent one for estrogen compounds and compounds often found in personal care products, Porter said.

"EPA uses the data obtained to determine where these contaminants occur and whether they need to be regulated," she said.

New and improved facilities at GLWA's Water Works Park and at its Lake Huron treatment plant "will provide us with the opportunity to further test and advance our treatment process beyond (only regulatory) compliance," Porter said.

Baker said her group is now beginning to look at how contaminants of emerging concern impact the organisms that live around them.

"This was kind of the beginning to know what's out there, and where are we finding it," she said. "Now we are looking in fish, in the blood and in the muscle of different fish species, focusing on fish that someone might eat."

The best solution to these contaminants is to capture them at the source where they are generated, or to not use them at all, and instead use some safer alternative, Murray said.

"We can clean up contaminated sites like Zug Island or specific areas of concern in the Great Lakes," he said. "But once these are disbursed all over, it's really hard to do much at that point."

### Chapaton Basin and 9 Mile Drain Structural Repairs Project

Recent inspections were performed and various types of repairs in numerous locations were noted in the reports. Repairs primarily consist of chipping away damaged concrete, prepping the reinforcing steel and remaining concrete surfaces, and installing a specialized concrete product flush to adjacent surfaces.

## **Chapaton In-System Storage Project**

### **Project Description:**

The primary focus of the project is the construction of an access shaft and installation of the In-System Storage Device at Beaconsfield and Oak in Eastpointe. This project will achieve an additional 3.5 million gallons of storage within the 8.5 Mile Relief tunnel.

### Significant project tasks that have occurred over the past month:

- 1. Weiss has started working with DTE for utility relocation at Beaconsfield.
- 2. Construction activity letters were sent to Eastpointe and St. Clair Shores city councils on April 4, 2022. Resident letters were submitted on April 6, 2022.

- 4. Construction activities and equipment staging to begin in mid to late April.

#### Dear Honorable Council:

As you may recall, staff from our office briefed you last year about an upcoming vital infrastructure construction project: The In-System Storage project in the 8½ Mile Relief Drain Drainage District. The district serves the cities of Eastpointe and St. Clair Shores, handling the combined sanitary sewer flow and storm water runoff and snow melt from all of Eastpointe and most of St. Clair Shores. The In-System Storage project uses existing infrastructure by installing an inflatable bladder inside the large interceptor pipe far below the surface near Oak Avenue, from Interstate 94 to Boulder Street. When inflated, the bladder will permit combined sewer flow to be "stored" upstream and released as needed to maintain flow without creating a risk of basement flooding.

The purpose of increased storage capacity is to reduce combined sewer overflows and discharges of CSO's into our beautiful Lake St. Clair. Although chemically-treated discharges of combined flow are permitted by the state, they have gone on for decades. No longer should we be pushing this problem onto future generations. Water quality equals quality of life, and this important project is one step to help us to better protect the lake and the environment. We believe this important project can help reduce CSO's from the Chapaton Retention Basin by 30%.

With the recent announcement of federal earmarks and state funding to Macomb County for key sewer projects, we do not anticipate that the \$17 million In-System Storage project will itself not require an increase in sewer rates for the ratepayers in Eastpointe and St. Clair Shores, which is great news.

The reason we are doing this project is to protect water quality. Clean water is a common goal that we all share.

Also, we want to notify you about construction activity associated with this project that will get underway soon and which will impact motorists:

• Excavation to install a manhole and below-grade odor control device. Excavation is expected to commence in mid- to late April and continue into May, and will result in intermittent traffic control and temporary closures of the northbound left lane and southbound left lane of Kelly Road at Oak Avenue.

• Depending on DTE Energy's utility relocation schedule, excavation will begin in May to construct an access shaft at the intersection of Beaconsfield at Oak Avenue, to install the In-System Storage device inside the interceptor pipe. This will continue to June 2023 and will require traffic detours around the construction area as well as for overhead utility relocation. Equipment will be staged starting in mid-April in the greenbelt between Beaconsfield and Interstate 94, for subsequent installation of a control building.

Please notify your police and fire departments about the upcoming construction and traffic impact. We also ask you to consider posting this traffic information on your city website.

Dear City of Eastpointe Residents and Businesses:

When almost 4 inches of rain fell last June on Eastpointe and St. Clair Shores, our staff at the Chapaton Pump Station on Nine Mile Road at Jefferson Avenue worked hard to manage the flow of combined sanitary sewage and storm water runoff and were able to prevent basement flooding in thousands of homes.

While preventing basement flooding is always the goal during heavy rain events, sewer systems and open-channel drains are not capable of handling the intensity and length of severe rainstorms. In that June 25-26 storm, parts of northeast Detroit and the Grosse Pointes were hit with 6-8 inches of rain, and flooding was extensive and costly.

During significant rain events, combined sewer overflows are chemically-treated to kill E-coli bacteria before being discharged into Lake St. Clair. These CSO's are permitted by the state but they have gone on for decades. No longer should we be pushing this problem onto future generations.

To help reduce CSO's, the Macomb County Public Works Office will soon begin construction of a vital infrastructure project. Known as an "In-System Storage project" in the drainage district serving all of Eastpointe and most of St. Clair Shores, it will use existing infrastructure by installing an inflatable bladder inside the large interceptor pipe far below the surface of Oak Street between Boulder Street and Interstate 94.

When inflated, the bladder will permit combined sewer flow to be "stored" upstream and released as needed to maintain flow without creating an increased risk of basement flooding. The purpose of increased storage capacity is to reduce combined sewer overflows and discharges of CSO's into our beautiful Lake St. Clair. Water quality equals quality of life, and this important project is one step to help us to better protect the lake and the environment. We believe this important project can help reduce CSO's from the Chapaton Retention Basin by 30%.

As you may recall, I, along with Chief Deputy Public Works Commissioner Brian Baker and Operations & Flow Manager Vince Astorino, briefed you last year about an upcoming vital infrastructure construction project: The "In-System Storage" project in the 8 ½ Mile Relief Drain Drainage District.

The district serves the cities of Eastpointe and St. Clair Shores, handling the combined sanitary sewer flow and storm water runoff and snow melt from all of Eastpointe and most of St. Clair Shores. The In-System Storage project uses existing infrastructure by installing an inflatable bladder inside the large interceptor pipe far below the surface along Rosedale Street from Interstate 94 to Greater Mack, then through the Chapoton Woods subdivision, down Malvern Street to Nine Mile Road and terminating at the Chapaton Pump Station at Nine Mile at Jefferson Avenue.

When inflated, the bladder will permit combined sewer flow to be "stored" upstream and released as needed to maintain flow without creating a risk of basement flooding.

The purpose of increased storage capacity is to reduce combined sewer overflows and discharges of CSO's into our beautiful Lake St. Clair. Although chemically-treated discharges of combined flow are permitted by the state, they have gone on for decades. No longer should we be pushing this problem onto future generations. Water quality equals quality of life, and this important project is one step to help us to better protect the lake and the environment. We believe this important project can help reduce CSO's by 30%.

With the recent announcement of federal earmarks and state funding to Macomb County for key sewer projects, we do not anticipate that the \$17 million In-System Storage project will itself not require an increase in sewer rates for the ratepayers in Eastpointe and St. Clair Shores, which is great news.

The reason we are doing this project is to protect water quality. Clean water is a common goal that we all share.

Also, we want to notify you about construction activity associated with this project that will get underway soon and which will impact motorists:

- Excavation to install a manhole and below-grade odor control device at Greater Mack Avenue at Gaukler Street, starting in May. Initial work will begin in mid- to late April, resulting in intermittent traffic control including temporary lane closures.
- In Eastpointe, excavation to install a manhole and below-grade odor control device. Excavation is expected to commence in mid- to late April and continue into May, andwill result in intermittent traffic control and temporary closures of the northbound left lane and southbound left lane of Kelly Road at Oak Avenue. Depending on DTE Energy's utility relocation schedule, excavation will begin in May to construct an access shaft at the intersection of Beaconsfield at Oak Avenue, to install the In-System Storage device inside the interceptor pipe. This will continue to June 2023 and will require traffic detours around the construction area as well as for overhead utility relocation. Equipment will be staged starting in mid-April in the greenbelt between Beaconsfield and Interstate 94, for subsequent installation of a control building.

Please notify your police and fire departments about the upcoming construction and traffic impact. We also ask you to consider posting this traffic information on your city website.

#### Dear St. Clair Shores Residents and Businesses:

When almost 4 inches of rain fell last June on Eastpointe and St. Clair Shores, our staff at the Chapaton Pump Station on Nine Mile Road at Jefferson Avenue worked hard to manage the flow of combined sanitary sewage and storm water runoff and were able to prevent basement flooding in thousands of homes.

While preventing basement flooding is always the goal during heavy rain events, sewer systems and open-channel drains are not capable of handling the intensity and length of some rainstorms. In that June 25-26 storm, parts of northeast Detroit and the Grosse Pointes were hit with 6-8 inches of rain.

During significant rain events, combined sewer overflows are chemically-treated to kill E-coli bacteria before being discharged into Lake St. Clair. These CSO's are permitted by the state but they have gone on for decades. No longer should we be pushing this problem onto future generations.

To help reduce CSO's, the Macomb County Public Works Office will soon begin construction of a vital infrastructure project. Known as an "In-System Storage" project in the drainage district serving all of Eastpointe and most of St. Clair Shores, it will use existing infrastructure by installing an inflatable bladder inside the large interceptor pipe far below the surface along Rosedale Street from Interstate 94 to Greater Mack, then through the Chapoton Woods subdivision, down Malvern Street to Nine Mile Road and terminating at the Chapaton Pump Station at Nine Mile at Jefferson Avenue. When inflated, the bladder will permit combined sewer flow to be "stored" upstream and released as needed to maintain flow without creating a risk of basement flooding.

The purpose of increased storage capacity is to reduce combined sewer overflows and discharges of CSO's into our beautiful Lake St. Clair. Water quality equals quality of life, and this important project is one step to help us to better protect the lake and the environment. This important project will significantly reduce CSO's from the Chapaton Retention Basin.

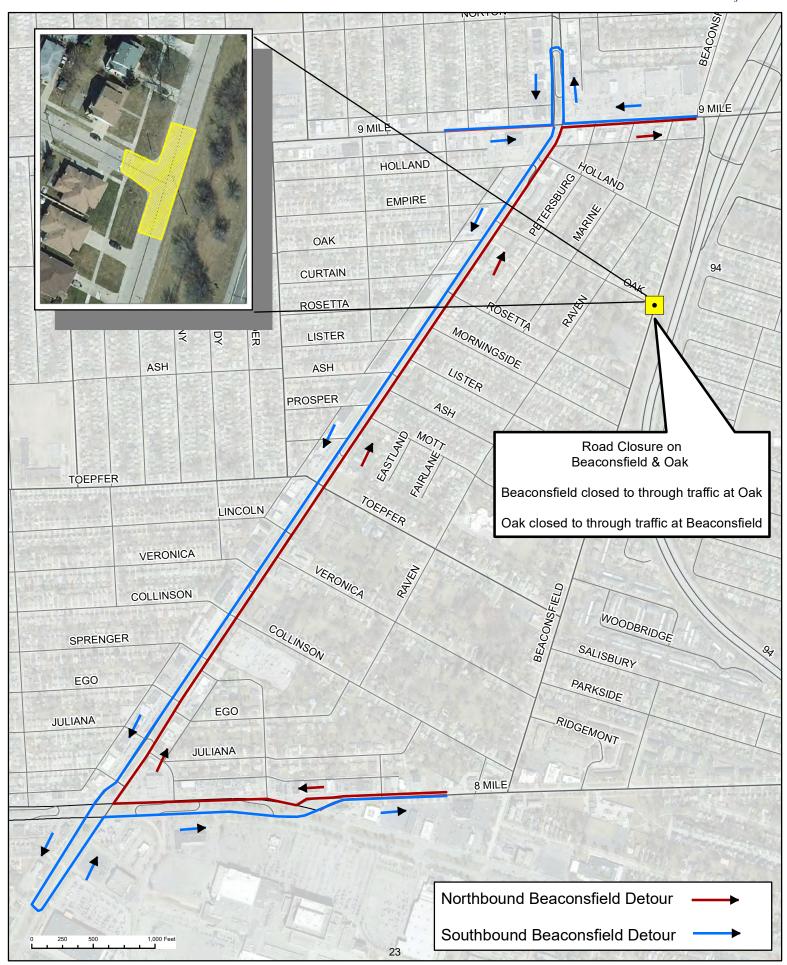

Afforded liability limits are separate from each other. Payment of claims for one line of coverage will not affect or reduce the limits dedicated to the remaining lines of coverage. Please refer to policy forms for terms, definitions, conditions, and exclusions.

The deductibles apply to both the payment of claim adjustment expenses and third-party damage payments. Once the deductible is exhausted, the specific limit is dedicated to the payment of third-party damages alone; claim expenses are outside of the afforded limits. Argonaut requires the continued third-party administrator (TPA) relationship with the ASU Group or other approved TPA.

Argonaut has included their proprietary "360" endorsement which adds the following coverage enhancements to the General Liability: Blanket Additional Insured (when required by written contract, agreement, or permit). Broadcasting, Publishing, and Telecasting offenses are covered under Personal Injury. By separate endorsement, Limited Pollution Liability Coverage (extended for Property Damage under the General Liability policy) is added for the reverse flow of sewage (endorsement GL-210 [07/00]).

As with the expiring contract, Argonaut is offering: 1) a traditional underlying and excess policy format. In addition to securing the afforded liability coverages, we continue to monitor additions or improvements to the districts' physical assets. We have been advised that no measurable changes occurred over the past year. You will recall that all property insurance is secure under Macomb County's property insurance policy.

Thank you for the opportunity to provide our services for this project.

As discussed in pervious conversations, Pullman SST has endured hardships associated with the project due to a number of reasons, in particular: added duration due to inclement weather, other trades work preventing us from working, an annual fishing tournament, and additional signage costs per the request of the county. Total value of this revised Work Change Directive is \$14,939.15.

There were approx. thirty-one calendar days that we were unable to work (which amounts to 6 weeks of working days) -- most of which were able to mitigate as best possible by placing our crew at another location/project. We had rental equipment onsite that added to our costs due the extended duration, which included two (2) scissor lifts and two (2) skid steers. Per the request of your Engineer, NTH, we added additional material in various locations, as well as additional signage. Costs are as follows:

Labor Downtime: \$68.24 per hour at 112 hrs. \$7,643.65
Rental equipment: \$2,197.00 per month at 6 weeks: \$3,295.50
Additional material per NTH/Engineer request: Lump sum value: \$4,000,00
\$14,939.50

It's worth noting that our initial contract value was \$736,950.00. To date, we have approved costs of \$460,416.00, leaving a balance on the contract of \$276,534.00. This "additional" \$14,939.15 would certainly help our cause, as we would like to believe that the county can honorably and fairly assist Pullman SST, Inc. to off-set our additional costs with this request, as there is certainly room in the project budget for it.

I'll send the city of Eastpointe a confirmation email regarding our schedule under separate cover. And... I'm having issues with my PDF Creator; so, I'll send the lien waiver to you in the morning.

Further, as discussed in today's meeting, the additional work in the aeration chamber (that's above and beyond our contractual obligation) simply cannot be performed at the current unit pricing given the in-field environment and obstacles. As such, please consider the following:

Shallow Depth: \$ 270.00 PSF

Deep (3"+): \$385.00 PSF

The additional cost is related to the access element only. We assume/anticipate the area to be +/- 70 SF, which means we'll be moving our scaffolding at least twice for both the demo and the put-back each... so, 4 "moves" are included. Should the area expand further – and require an additional "move" – then additional costs may apply (although, hoping I can absorb that part given the extra quantities...).
