The Macomb HOME Consortium is comprised of the Urban County of Macomb (itself comprised of 20 communities), Clinton Township, and the Cities of Roseville and Sterling Heights. The Macomb HOME Consortium's 2022 HOME grant allocation was \$1,875,614. The Urban County's 2022 CDBG allocation was \$1,818,600. Macomb County opted to defer its 2022 ESG allocation to the State of Michigan. This document reports the Consortium's HOME Program and the Urban County's CDBG accomplishments. Each of the four Consortium member communities teamed with other entities to implement programs and activities. This report includes the accomplishments of the Urban County of Macomb (County). The other Consortium members will separately report their CDBG accomplishments. Further detail is found in the following narrative, with an activity breakdown in IDIS Reports PR03 and 06.

The Urban County of Macomb, along with our housing and service partners, provided affordable housing, essential infrastructure, public facilities, and human services to low- and moderate-income (LMI) people, the elderly, homeless people, and "at-risk" populations.

Areas of high priority identified in the consolidated plan include:

- Priority Objective #1: Improve public facilities and infrastructure
- Priority Objective #2: Make available appropriate housing
- Priority Objective #3: Address the needs of homeless and at-risk families
- **Priority Objective #4:** Provide and expand human services
- Priority Objective #5: Foster economic development
- Priority Objective #6: Address post-foreclosure housing crisis needs
- **Priority Objective #7:** Expand comprehensive planning, management and capacity

The County has insufficient funds to address each priority objective every year. It is the intention of the members of the Macomb HOME Consortium to address each priority objective at least once during the life of the current Consolidated Plan with the understanding that not each member will address each priority over the life of the plan.

Other major initiatives undertaken during the program year include:

- On March 27, 2021, Congress passed the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act). As part of the Act, entitlement communities were awarded supplemental Community Development Block Grant and Emergency Solutions Grant funds known as CDBG-CV and ESG-CV to be used in response to the coronavirus pandemic. The County received its first round CDBG-CV and ESG-CV funding in April 2021. Subsequent allocations were later announced and the County was allocated additional funding under ESG-CV2 and CDBG-CV3. Macomb County was not awarded funds under CDBG-CV2. CDBG-CV1 = \$1,110,240; CDBG-CV2 = \$0; CDBG-CV3 = \$1,530,725; ESG-CV1 = \$541,486; ESG-CV2 = \$801,422. During the 2022 program year, staff time was redirected to expending the CDBG-CV and ESG-CV funds. A list of CDBG-CV accomplishments is provided in the following table "CDBG-CV Accomplishments". A narrative for the CDBG-CV accomplishment is provided as "CDBG-CV Accomplishments Narrative".
- Staff time was redirected from the annual CDBG, HOME and ESG allocations to administering the CDBG-CV and ESG-CV allocations.

On March 11, 2021 President Biden signed the American Rescue Plan (ARP) into law. The ARP provided additional HOME funds for activities that primarily benefit qualifying populations including individuals and families who are homeless, at risk of homelessness, and other vulnerable populations. Macomb County submitted its HOME-ARP plan to HUD during the 2022 program year.

Narrative

The percentage (%) of the geographic distribution and location of investments shown under "Identify the Geographic Distribution and Location of Investments" was based on the expenditure of all grant funds during the 2022 program year which included funds drawn for prior year projects. Note: The percentage reported under "Planned Percentage of Allocation" reflects the distribution of funds under the 2022 CDBG grant. The County allows subrecipients 18-months to complete projects involving construction for CDBG and there is a 4-year maximum for HOME per federal regulation. As a result the variation between "Planned Percentage of Allocation" and "Actual Percentage of Allocation" is caused by projects that carry-over into the next program year.

Note regarding grant administration: the total amount expended for grant administration did not exceed the specific program limitations (CDBG 20%, HOME 10%, and ESG 7.5%).

Geographic Distribution:

Macomb County is diverse, with older development and population centers generally, but not always, found in the south and east of the County. The frequency and intensity of development generally diminishes to the north, particularly in the northeast and north central areas where, except for several smaller communities, rural conditions predominate. As a result, the Urban County of Macomb is governed by "home rule" and CDBG funding is allocated to the 20 member communities on a formula basis less County needs such as program administration, housing rehabilitation, and public services administered by the County.

It is the County's philosophy that each unit of general local government knows local needs best. Therefore, each community determines how to allocate resources within its geography in compliance with overall program rules. The "home rule" allows the communities to identify activities and assistance areas, based on citizen input informed by law and regulation, to address local needs and priorities that were consistent with the goals of the MHC Consolidated Plan.

ESG and HOME funds, less administration funds, were distributed throughout the jursidiction of the Macomb HOME Consoritum.

Leveraging

Explain how federal funds leveraged additional resources (private, state and local funds), including a description of how matching requirements were satisfied, as well as how any publicly owned land or property located within the jurisdiction that were used to address the needs identified in the plan.

The combined effect of leveraged funds significantly extends beyond the formula allocations awarded to the County. The partnership between the County and partner organziations has provided more bricks and mortar improvements, decent and affordable housing, and higher levels of service than would otherwise be possible.

The following is a list of leverage funds during the reporting period:

- Required HOME Program Match donations of materials and labor (Macomb County Habitat for Humanity), and foregone taxes (Oakwood PILOT);
- Homebuyer cash contributions (down-payment through Habitat and Community Housing Network);
- Program income from Housing Rehabilitation loans;
- Required Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) Program Match sources include CDBG, United Way, other federal funds, and private donations and fundraising;
- Community general funds used in combination with CDBG funds for public infrastructure and public facility projects; and
- Publicly owned property improved under this plan included, Rotary Park, Lions Park and Memorial Park (all located in the City of Center Line);
- Tax foreclosed residential properties purchased below market value

The affordable housing one-year goals listed in the above chart are the combined totals for all members of the Macomb HOME Consortium (Macomb County, Sterling Heights, Roseville, and Clinton Township). Any notable differences between the one-year goal and actual outcomes are described as follows:

Rental Assistance: The increase to the total number of households supported was due to an increase of CDBG-CV funds allocated to provide rent assistance.

Narrative Information

The funding to provide homeless with affordable housing units was provided through the Emergecy Soultions Grant (ESG) and ESG-CV. The table "Numbers of Households Served" above does not provide a column for ESG and ESG-CV persons served. ESG information is provided as an attachment to section CR-00 of this report (2022 SAGE Report). The data provided for HOME and CDBG was taken from the IDIS PR23 report.

Participants in ESG funded rapid rehousing (RRH) and homelessness prevention (HP) programs may not have an income that exceeds 30% AMI. As a result, those households would be reported as extremely-low income. The ESG RRH regulations do not allow assistance to be provided to low- and moderate-income households.

Households served meeting Section 215 requirements: Seven (7) new housing units were created during the 2022 program year.

In regards to "worst case housing needs":

The County provides planning support and services to communities, works with communities to mitigate the effects of local plans on adjacent communities and to assure consistency with regional planning objectives. These functions do not directly affect housing or affordable housing, which fall more appropriately within the purview of local control. The County, however, does administer and promote affordable housing programs. It spearheaded the creation of the Macomb HOME Consortium, in order to fund affordable housing for developmentally-disabled adults, and homebuyers. The County also works with the private developers of affordable housing, particularly in older communities to promote neighborhood stability. The County seeks, and will utilize, opportunities when feasible.

Efforts to address the needs of persons with disabilities: In prior program years the Macomb HOME Consortium has funded affordable rental housing for persons with disabilities, specifically developmentally disabled adults, through its partnership with Community Housing Network (CHN). CHN is currently acting as one of the County's Community Housing Development Organizations (CHDO).

In addition, Macomb Community Action administers a Home Injury Prevention Program (HIPP). This program provides safety devices such as grab bars, shower chairs, transfer benches, and temporary modular ramps for disabled seniors. This program is funded with Area Agency on Aging (AAA1B) funds and serves as a prime example of the benefits of leveraging funds outside of CDBG and HOME to address needs within the community.

During the 2022 program year Macomb County also provided grant funded assistance to persons with disabilities to modify their existing housing to meet their mobility needs through the existing housing rehabilitation program.

CR-25 - Homeless and Other Special Needs 91.220(d, e); 91.320(d, e); 91.520(c)

Evaluate the jurisdiction's progress in meeting its specific objectives for reducing and ending homelessness through:

Reaching out to homeless persons (especially unsheltered persons) and assessing their individual needs

Macomb County is an active partner with the Macomb County Continuum of Care (CoC). The CoC conducts Safe Haven events, which are outreach events for homeless and at-risk people to access shelter, housing, support services, a meal, medical screenings and clothing.

While not funded with HUD funds from Macomb County, the CoC performs outreach and assessment to local homeless people. They use an assessment tool to assess people's individual needs and make referrals to agencies that can assist in meeting those needs. Outreach is provided by the PATH program, an agency serving homeless youth, and a local non-profit organization. These organizations provide regularly scheduled outreach in the community. The Team frequents soup kitchens and other places where homeless populations congregate. They provide resources, referrals and care packages.

The CoC also has a Community Engagement and Outreach Committee that is comprised of members from CoC agencies. The committee members plan the Safe Haven events and work with the outreach agencies to ensure people who are literally homeless are connected to resources.

Addressing the emergency shelter and transitional housing needs of homeless persons

Macomb County provided both CDBG and ESG funds to two emergency shelters during the grant year. MCREST rotates through area churches sheltering up to 60 men, women and children per night. Turning Point shelters survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault and their children. Both shelters provide case management to residents.

Macomb County provided ESG-CV funds to MCREST during the 2022 grant year to address homeless emergency shelter needs that were related to COVID-19. MCREST, which previously rotated through area churches was forced to change their program model and instead sheltered the homeless in an area motel. This model increased program costs greatly.

Helping low-income individuals and families avoid becoming homeless, especially extremely low-income individuals and families and those who are: likely to become homeless after being discharged from publicly funded institutions and systems of care (such as health care facilities, mental health facilities, foster care and other youth facilities, and corrections programs and institutions); and, receiving assistance from public or private agencies that address housing, health, social services, employment, education, or youth needs Macomb Community Action administered a rent and utility assistance program that was funded with \$73,053,080 from the Department of Treasury which was provided through the American Rescue Plan. The program was specifically designed to avoid evictions that were the result of the COVID-19 pandemic. The program called the Covid Emergency Rental Assistance (CERA) Program, kept 16,763 low-income Macomb County residents from becoming homeless. Macomb Community Action also used \$1,011,210 of the County's CDBG-CV funds to keep an additional 226 low-income Macomb County residents from becoming homeless.

Macomb County also provided CDBG funds to non-profit organizations that provide services to low income residents which would free up their resources for housing costs. Samaritan House and Shelby Lions Club used CDBG funds to provide emergency food to residents in need. The Macomb Community Action Grass and Snow Program provides lawn cutting and snow removal, allowing seniors and disabled residents to remain in their homes. Interfaith Volunteer Caregivers used CDBG funds to provide basic home chore assistance to income eligible seniors and disabled persons.

In addition, member agencies of the Macomb County Continuum of Care and their staff provided the following services for residents in need: emergency shelters, transitional housing, specialized housing program, youth services, homeless prevention programs, emergency support services, family support services and supportive case management. These service were provided through a variety of funding sources including State, Federal, and private donations.

Helping homeless persons (especially chronically homeless individuals and families, families with children, veterans and their families, and unaccompanied youth) make the transition to permanent housing and independent living, including shortening the period of time that individuals and families experience homelessness, facilitating access for homeless individuals and families to affordable housing units, and preventing individuals and families who were recently homeless from becoming homeless again

In 2022, ESG funds were paid out to two emergency shelters, MCREST and Turning Point to pay for operating costs. ESG-CV funds were also paid out to MCREST to pay for COVID-19 related shelter costs. The goal of these programs is to assist homeless clients to become housed and self-sufficient.

MCREST also utilized ESG funds to administer a rapid re-housing program (RRH). The RRH program provided eligible families with assistance such as security deposits and short term rental assistance

Macomb County collaborates with the CoC, attending meetings and consulting on homeless matters, working towards the mutual goal of ending homelessness in the County.

CR-30 - Public Housing 91.220(h); 91.320(j)

Actions taken to address the needs of public housing

The public housing authorities located within Macomb County are entities completely separate from Macomb County Government and, therefore, the County has no control over the quality of the housing and resident initiatives. Some of the communities which fall under the Urban County for CDBG funding do have public housing. These communities have the option to use CDBG funds to improve their public housing units

Actions taken to encourage public housing residents to become more involved in management and participate in homeownership

As previously stated, the public housing authorities (PHAs) located within Macomb County are entities completly separate from Macomb County Government, and thereore, the County has no control over the PHAs. However, the County encouraged PHAs to expand opportunities to their residents to become more involved in management and to participate in homeownership. In addition, the County communicated to developers and CHDO's participating in the County's HOME program the need to solict program applicants through PHA's.

Actions taken to provide assistance to troubled PHAs

The County was only recently made aware that the Mount Clemens Housing Commission (MCHC) received a "troubled" designation from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). A score of 60 was required to receive a passing grade. The MCHC received a score of 59. The MCHC is in a binding recovery agreement with HUD to make sure that improvements are being made.

CR-35 - Other Actions 91.220(j)-(k); 91.320(i)-(j)

Actions taken to remove or ameliorate the negative effects of public policies that serve as barriers to affordable housing such as land use controls, tax policies affecting land, zoning ordinances, building codes, fees and charges, growth limitations, and policies affecting the return on residential investment. 91.220 (j); 91.320 (i)

Based on the structure of the County, the County does not have control over local land use, certain tax policies, zoning ordinances, building codes, fees and charges, and growth limitations.

County Actions:

- The County remains active in housing task forces such as Continuum of Care;
- Macomb Community Action also provides eviction and rent assistance with various funding;
- Homeownership and money management classes are also made available through Macomb County Michigan State University Extension services;
- Financial literacy classes are provided by Macomb Community Action; and
- The County Treasurer's Office has information available on its website for property owners on tax foreclosure prevention: https://treasurer.macombgov.org/Treasurer-TaxForeclosurePrevention

Actions taken to address obstacles to meeting underserved needs. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The main obstacle to meeting underserved community development needs is funding availability. While CDBG funds can be used to assist with renovations and creation of new public facilities and capital needs projects, other priority community needs, housing and human services, must also be considered which places a strain on already limited funding. To address this obstacle the County has created many important public/private partnerships to address community needs. During the 2022 reporting period the County partnered with the following organizations to address community needs:

- Habitat for Humanity and Community Housing Network housing;
- Care House assitance for families of children that are victims of sexual abuse;
- Armada PAL summer camp for low-income children;
- Interfaith Volunteer Caregivers household chores for senior citizens;
- Macomb County Rotating Emergency Shelter Team (MCREST)- shelter for the homeless;
- Macomb Community Action Grass & Snow Program- provides seniors with snow removal and grass cutting;
- Turning Point shelter for victims of domestic abuse;
- Wigs4Kids wigs for income-eligible children that have experience hair loss due to illness;
- Samaritan House food assistance; and
- Shelby Lions Club food baskets at Christmas for income eligible families

Actions taken to reduce lead-based paint hazards. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The County continues to address lead-based paint (LBP) through implementation of the Lead-Safe Housing Regulations. The County includes LBP risk assessments on rehabilitation work pursuant to 24 CFR Part 35. LBP hazards are addressed using lead abatement work practices. Contractors performing the work are licensed LBP abasement contractors.

Actions taken to reduce the number of poverty-level families. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

During the 2022 program year, Community Development was a divison of Macomb Community Action. Macomb Community Action (MCA) is a Community Action Agency providing a network of comprehensive educational, economic and social services to Macomb County residents in need to diminish the causes and effects of poverty. Macomb Community Action was established in 1964 and strives to continually respond to meet the needs of the community and the people we serve.

Macomb Community Action has programs for senior citizens like Meals on Wheels, Dining Senior Style, Senior Citizen Chore Service and Home Injury Control; emergency food assistance, utilities and housing through the Macomb Food Program and the Community Action Centers; free early childhood education through Head Start and Early Head Start; transportation services; and home weatherization and energy education services through Home Preservation and Energy.

In addition to Macomb Community Action's programs, the Consolidated Plan includes an anti-poverty strategy addressed in the over-arching community development goals included in the Annual Action Plan as follows:

- Priority Objective #2 Make available appropriate housing;
- Priority Objective #3 Address the needs of the Homeless and At-Risk Families; and
- Priority Objective #4 Provide and Expand Human Services.

During the 2022 reporting period these objectives were addressed as follows:

Make available appropriate housing

- Macomb County used CDBG and HOME funds for housing rehabilitation;
- Macomb County Habitat for Humanity developed housing that will be sold to low- to moderateincome homebuyers (funded through prior year grants); and
- Community Housing Network constructed new rental housing that will be leased to low-income tenants (funded through prior year grants) and is rehabilitating four single family residential homes that will be sold to income-eligible homebuyers.

Address the needs of homeless and at-risk families

- CDBG funding was provided to MCREST and Turning Point
- ESG funds were used to support Macomb Communit Action's homelessness prevention program
- ESG funds were provided to MCREST and Turning Point to support shelter operations.
- ESG and ESG-CV funds were provided to MCREST for a rapid re-housing program
- ESG-CV funds were provided to MCREST and Turning Point to support shelter operations for costs incurred during the COVID-19 pandemic

Provide and expand human services

- Armada PAL camp scholarships for income eligible program participants
- CARE House counseling and services for victims of abuse
- Wigs4Kids wigs for income eligible children that experience hair loss due to illness
- Samaritan House food assistance to income eligible families
- Macomb Community Action Grass & Snow Program grass cutting and snow removal
- Shelby Lions Club- food baskets for income eligible families during Christmas
- Interfaith Volunteer Caregivers home chore assistance for senior citizens
- Macomb County CDBG-CV funds were used to provide job training to income eligible applicants that experienced a financial hardship related to COVID-19
- Macomb County CDBG-CV funds were used to provide rent assistance to income eligible renters that experienced a financial hardship related to COVID-19

Actions taken to develop institutional structure. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

Although individual members (communities) determine their projects, effective program controls are in place. The County tracks expenditures and program progress, and ensures overall compliance. The County also:

- Monitors fund use to ensure timeliness, and monitor compliance with HOME requirements including continuing affordability, affirmative marketing, procurement, and labor standards, and share the results with members;
- Each member implements projects using its staff and using local procedures. The County uses documentation, including labor certifications, invoices and the like, to monitor individual projects for compliance. Each community corrects emergent problems, and the Couty provides technical assistance as needed;
- Monitors subrecipients, developers, and CHDO activities as prescribed by regualtion; and
- Finally, funding of the Continuum of Care is spent to overcome gaps in institutional structure and support their work of enhancing coordination of services to residents experiencing or at risk of experiencing homelessness through Project Homeless Connect Events, trainings and workshops of agencies and committee work to assist organizations in working together to overcome gaps in the system and barriers faced by clients.

Actions taken to enhance coordination between public and private housing and social service agencies. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The Macomb Homeless Coalition resigned from the multiple roles they held within the Continuum of Care (CoC) in January 2022 with very short notice. As a result, the remaining members of the CoC, with the support of Macomb County, spent most of the 2022 program year in a rebuilding phase. However, Macomb County and the members of the CoC remain committed to working together to overcome gaps in institutional structure and enhancing coordination of services for residents experiencing or at risk of experiencing homelessness. Efforts include connection events for those experiencing homelessness or at risk of homelessness, trainings and workshops for agencies, and committee work to assist organizations in working together to overcome gaps in the system and barriers faced by clients. The results of the collaberative efforts between the remaining members of the CoC and Macomb County County have been positive.

In addition, Macomb County – Macomb Community Action replaced the Macomb Homeless Coalition to become the single point of entry for Macomb County homeless. Macomb County staff provide direct financial assistance and referrals and other resources to those who are at risk of or experiencing homelessness.

Identify actions taken to overcome the effects of any impediments identified in the jurisdictions analysis of impediments to fair housing choice. 91.520(a)

The following is a summary of the impediments identified in the County's 2019 Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice (AI):

- Ensure that fair housing reports are shared with lending institutions, housing providers, and participating communities;
- Lack of fair housing education, awareness, and information within the public sector and the private sector;
- Racial and ethnic minorities are concentrated geographically within the county;
- Availability of affordable housing for protected classes;
- ADA education;
- Lack of formalized fair housing complaint and monitoring procedures;
- Increased complaint activity within the participating communities in recent program years

The County does not have sufficient funding to address all impediments every program year. The actions taken during this reporting period were subject to the availability of HUD funding and the availability of local resources (staff and funding). Training efforts were also impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. However, the County understands the importance of supporting Fair Housing and will continue to make best efforts to address the recommendations provided in the AI.

During this reporting period the following actions were taken to address the following impediments:

Lack of fair housing education, awareness, and information within the public sector and the private sector:

- Macomb County implemented a new process with its CDBG participating communities. Each community was required to complete a "Fair Housing Impact Statement for the Analysis of Impediments". This form lists the impediments that were identified in the 2019 AI and the corresponding action items to address each impediment. Each community was required to commit to address at least two action items during the 2019 program year and provide a narrative of how that would be achieved. Program staff followed up with each community to ensure compliance. Technical assistance was provided as needed.
- Macomb County sponsored a virtual training on June 28, 2023 (presented by the Fair Housing Center of MetropolitanDetroit). There were thirty-two attendees. The following topics were discussed along with a Q & A session on various Fair Housing related issues: Implementation of the Equal Access to Housing in HUD programs regardless of sexual orientation or gender identity (Equal Access Final Rule)Implementation of Equal Access in accordance with an individual's gender identity in HUD Community Planning and Development programs (Gender Identity Final Rule)
- Continental Management, the management company for the County HOME funded Oakwood Senior Housing facility, required all employees to complete Fair Housing training within 90 days of hire.

Racial and Ethnic Minorities are Concentrated Geographically within the County:

While not federally funded, the County addressed this impediment through its diversity and inclusion initiative (One Macomb). One Macomb was sparked by a comprehensive study titled, "The New Macomb County" prepared in partnership with Macomb Community College, Macomb County, and Data Driven Detroit in 2012. The study documented the County's changing demographics and the need to embrace our current and future make up of citizens that make Macomb their home.

CR-40 - Monitoring 91.220 and 91.230

Describe the standards and procedures used to monitor activities carried out in furtherance of the plan and used to ensure long-term compliance with requirements of the programs involved, including minority business outreach and the comprehensive planning requirements

For the purpose of monitoring subrecipients that are awarded funded through Macomb County's CDBG, HOME and/or ESG programs, program staff follows Macomb County's Subrecipient Contract & Monitoring Policy #FIN.2019.001 (included as an attachment to CR-00). The purpose of this policy is to provide a consistent methodology for conducting risk analyses and monitoring evaluations for all applicable subrecipients. The policy allows the County to effectively target its monitoring resources to subrecipients that pose the greatest risk to the integrity of the County's programs funded through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, including identification of the subrecipients to be monitored on-site or remotely, the program areas to be covered, and the depth of the review.

In addition to the steps outlined in this policy, staff will continue to conduct ongoing desk reviews of all subrecipient contract files. The reviews include but are not limited to:

- Closely monitoring procurement and labor compliance for all subrecipients during the time of procurement, contract award, and during project implementation;
- Review of all expenditures to determine if the expenditures are within the approved budget, if they support approved activities, and if costs are eligible; and
- Contractual compliance, including compliance with applicable Federal rules and regulations, and with state and local standards

Other actions to ensure compliance include:

- Provide technical assistance to communities and non-profit sub-recipients with respect to program design, administration, and compliance efforts;
- Monitor all housing construction projects to assure work quality, manage change orders, advise contractors concerning unanticipated problems, and require changes to work already performed when necessary;
- Monitored activity expenditures (through internal control reports) to ensure timely program implementation;
- Closed HOME rental projects with on-going affordability requirements: The County collects and reviews the annual certification from each property owner on tenant incomes, rents, and property condition throughout the affordability period. On-site property inspections are completed by the County at least once every three years. On-site monitoring visits are

scheduled in compliance with the County's Subrecipient Monitoring policy; and

Minority Business Outreach: A notice stating that any requests for bids will be posted on MITN is published annually in the newspaper, as well as sent to the Michigan Minority Contractors Association. This notice includes instructions on how to register with MITN. A list containing pertinent contact information of interested minority and women-owned business enterprises (M/WBE) firms is maintained and those firms are contacted directly for any appropriate contracting opportunities, whether by the County or by a sub-recipient. The list is updated annually, after each notice. The County continues to provide bid announcements to the Michigan Minority Supplier Development Council (MMSDC) who posts the announcements to facilitate member consideration of County contracting opportunities. Training on the use of minority business outreach responsibilities to municipal and non-profit sub-recipients of County CDBG takes place annually as part of the CDBG Implementation Workshop.

Citizen Participation Plan 91.105(d); 91.115(d)

Describe the efforts to provide citizens with reasonable notice and an opportunity to comment on performance reports.

This report was prepared in accordance with Part 91 of the Federal Register, and in accordance with the County's Citizen Participation Plan which provides citizens with a 15-day public comment period. A notice seeking public comment and participation in a public hearing was published on September 11, 2023, in the Macomb Daily. The public hearing was scheduled for September 26, 2023.

CR-45 - CDBG 91.520(c)

Specify the nature of, and reasons for, any changes in the jurisdiction's program objectives and indications of how the jurisdiction would change its programs as a result of its experiences.

Unfortunately, the negative social and economic effects COVID-19 carried over into the 2022 program year serverly impacting the County's and its subrecipient's ability to complete projects and conduct activities. It was not uncommon for projects to be delayed due to the ongoing labor and material shortage. In addition, the influx of federal funding overwhelmed community partners and challenged their capacity. Despite the challenges, Macomb County met HUD's expenditure timeliness requirement.

Challenges encountered during the 2022 program year included:

- Staff time was redirected from the annual CDBG, HOME and ESG allocations to administering the CDBG-CV and ESG-CV allocations;
- Influx of federal funding required extra staff time to ensure that assistance provided to beneficiaries did not result in a duplication of benefits;
- National labor shortage made it difficult for public facility and infrastructure projects to be completed as scheduled; and
- The increase in the cost of construction materials resulted in higher bids. As a result some projects were delayed or cancelled.

The current economic climate remains fluid and unpredictable. As a result, it should not be unexpected for projects to be delayed or cancelled. However, Macomb County program staff will continue to provide community partners with the support they need to execute activities and programs that are necessary to assist low-income persons.

A copy of the Macomb HOME Consortium's HOME rental unit inspection schedule is provided as an attachment to CAPER IDIS screen CR-00. NOTE: Each unit is based on Housing Quality Standards (HQS) and each property is inspected utilizing the HQS checklist. In addition to the on-site inspections conducted by the County, owners of rental housing are required to submit a certification documenting that each unit is suitable for occupancy annually.

Inspections were completed on six (6) "Erin Park" units owned by Community Housing Network. Minor deficiencies were found in one (1) unit including: a closet door off track, a missing door handle, a broken rear door jamb casing, and a furnace filter in need of replacement. The occupant of the unit was also storing items within the clearance area of the electrical panel. The deficiencies were corrected within the assigned time period.

Inspections were also completed at eight (8) "Oakwood Senior Housing" units owned by MHT. Minor deficiencies were found in three (3) units including: incorrect light fixture in the 1st floor hallway, incorrect plate cover near outlet by a kitchen sink, and a missing smoke detector. The deficiencies were corrected within the assigned time period.

No inspections were due during the 2022 program year at "Grafton Townhomes" and "Springhill" scattered site rentals.

Provide an assessment of the jurisdiction's affirmative marketing actions for HOME units. 24 CFR 91.520(e) and 24 CFR 92.351(a)

The objective of affirmative marketing is to ensure that participating jurisdictions (PJs), subrecipients, and project owners design and employ marketing plans that promote fair housing by ensuring outreach to all potentially eligible households, especially those least likely to apply for assistance. This requirement is applicable to rental and homebuyer projects containing five (5) or more HOME assisted housing units, regardless of the specific activity the HOME funds will finance (ex: acquisition, rehabilitation, and/or new construction). Two projects funded through the Macomb HOME Consortium that meet this criteria: Oakwood Manor Senior Living and Erin Park Townhomes.

Oakwood Manor is a 40 unit, three story rental housing complex that was built in 2013 and is managed

by Continental Management. This project was fully funded with HOME and NSP funds provided by Macomb County. Erin Park is a 52 unit community consisting of one, two, and three bedroom rental homes. Erin Park includes six (6) units that were funded with HOME funds provided by the Macomb HOME Consortium and is owned by Community Housing Network.

The County received a copy of the Affirmative Marketing reports from Continental Management and Community Housing Network. Both plans have been reviewed for compliance with the requirements found at 24 CFR 92.351.

Both plans have been successful as reflected in the racial statistics for the existing tenants and low vacancy rates for both Erin Park and Oakwood Senior Housing. As units become available, Continental Mangement and Community Housing Network will continue to expand their marketing actions through the use of community organizations, places of worship, employment centers, fair housing groups, and housing counseling agencies.

During the 2022 program year, Macomb County received \$257,797.56 in HOME program income. Per the County's Annual Action Plan, program income is designated for housing rehabiliation less 10% for program administration (PA) as allowed by regulation. The County's housing rehabilitation program has a set assistance limit of \$48,0000 (\$40,000 + 20% contingency). Total project costs may exceed this amount to account for inspections and project delivery. As a result, the program income will allow the County to assist approximately five (5) low- to moderate-income homeowners with necessary repairs on their home.

Describe other actions taken to foster and maintain affordable housing. 24 CFR 91.220(k) (STATES ONLY: Including the coordination of LIHTC with the development of affordable housing). 24 CFR 91.320(j)

The Macomb County Continuum of Care exists to ensure stability, enhance funding opportunities, and increase inter-agency collaboration, among other things. The CoC receives funding to overcome gaps in institutional structure and support their work of enhancing coordination of services to residents experiencing or at risk of experiencing homelessness through community connection events, trainings and workshops, and committee work to assist organizations in working together to overcome gaps in the system and barriers faced by clients. The Coalition has also become the single point of entry for Macomb County, providing direct financial assistance and referrals and other resources to those who are at risk of or experiencing homelessness. The results of the County's relationship with the CoC have been excellent, and collaboration between Macomb County and the CoC continues to evolve.

• The public housing authorities located within Macomb County are entities completely separate from Macomb County Government and, therefore, the County has no control over the quality of

the housing and resident initiatives. Some of the communities which fall under the Urban County for CDBG funding do have public housing. These communities are able, and encouraged, to use CDBG funds to improve their public housing units.

- Projects using CDBG and HOME strictly followed federal regulations regarding lead based paint.
- The County will continue to address the fair housing goals identified in its Analysis for Impediments to Fair Housing through educational efforts provided in collaberation with the Fair Housing Center for Metropolitan Detroit.
- During the 2022 program year, Macomb Community Action used CDBG-CV funds to provide rent assistance to those at risk of becoming homeless due to the impacts of COVID-19.
- Many elderly, low-income and disabled homeowners are unable to fund needed home repairs. Macomb County's Housing Rehabilitation Program provides income-eligible homeowners with assistance to complete necessary repairs to their homes. The program has three levels of assistance. The maximum assistance provided under the program for the purpose of bringing up the entire home to code is \$40,000 (\$48,000 total with 20% contingency) – assistance provided as a no-interest deferred-payment mortgage. The second level of assistance is a limited repair program with a program maximum of \$10,000 (\$12,000 total with 20% contingency) – assistance is provided as a grant. A third level, Minor Home Repair, provides \$1,000 of repairs to eligible homeowners. This assistance is provided as a grant to the homeowner. The County also finds ways to integrate the County's Weatherization program as part of the rehab projects for the purpose of leveraging funds.
- HOME funds were provided to Community Housing Network (a qualifed CHDO) to acquire and rehabilitate four (4) single family homes that were sold to income eligible buyers.

A community development staff member regularly attends CoC meetings bimonthly and a representative from the CoC serves on the review committee for ESG subrecipient applications. The CoC's ranking criteria and performance outcome measures for new applicants was used to develop the ranking and review scoring tool used to review ESG applications.

The CoC Compliance Committee continues to review performance at a project level. The Collaborate Applicant (Macomb Community Action) reviews performance outcomes and coordinated entry participation. The performance and coordinated entry compliance reviews are completed by the HMIS Systems Team and the CoC Coordinator.

Currently, ESG funded emergency shelter subrecipients submit quarterly reporting forms which includes performance measures such as: the number of people they're serving and shelter utilization rate.

Table 1 – Accomplishments – Program Year

Goal: Address the Needs of Homeless & At Risk Families. Rapid rehousing and homeless persons overnight shelter activities are both funded with ESG and ESG-CV funds. The actual number of persons provided with tenant-based rental assistance/rapid rehousing was less than expected due to the large amount of funding that was made available through the U.S. Department of Treasury's Covid Emergency Rental Assistance (CERA) program. The number of persons provided overnight shelter was less than expected because many of the area churches that provided shelter prior to COVID-19 still had not opened their doors back to the homeless due to lingering concerns related to the pandemic.

Goal: Improve Public Facilities and Infrastructure. The County provides 20 units of local government with funding for activities under this goal. Communities are allowed up to 18 months to complete the project. Accomplishments for each project is entered when funds are drawn and updated again when the project is completed. If a funded activity does not begin within the reporting period, the accomplishments for the activity will not appear in the "actual" column of this table. As a result, the accomplishments would not be reported until the following year. Consequently, the expected vs. actual number of persons assisted will vary and it will appear that goals are not being met or are being far exceeded. For the 2022 program year, most of the projects that fall under this goal were significantly delayed due to the ongoing labor and material shortage. This includes projects funded with CDBG or CDBG-CV funds.

Goal: Make Available Appropriate Housing. The number of homeowner housing rehabilitated was less than expected due to delays caused by the ongoing labor and materials shortages. The number of homeowner housing added was less than expected for the same reasons.

Goal: Provide and Expand Human Services. Funding for this goal was provided by the CDBG and CDBG-CV programs. The increase to the actual number of beneficiaries was a result of the funding provided by CDBG-CV.

Since the data in this table is pre-populated, the variance will continue in subsequent CAPERs. To ensure that outcomes are being met, program staff does monitor expected vs. actual accomplishments. If a subrecipient's project fails to meet the expected outcome, staff works with the community to ensure the quality of data being reported.

Table 2 – Accomplishments – Strategic Plan to Date

The data in this table is pre-populated based on the expected outcomes included in the 5-year Strategic Plan. The 2022 program year was the fourth year in the five-year 2019-2023 Consolidated Plan. As a result, it should be expected that the percent complete for each category is low. In addition, there are insufficient funds to address each goal every program year resulting in some goals being funded more than others from year to year.

EFFECTIVE DATE: Immediate. Applicable to all contracts active for the 2019 audit period and thereafter. Supersedes related policies throughout the county only when policies conflict.

ISSUE DATE: November 18, 2019

I. REASON FOR THE POLICY

The Subrecipient Contract & Monitoring Policy exists in order to provide guidance to all grant managers and their staff throughout all departments in Macomb County Government regarding required elements of subrecipient contracts and risk assessment-based monitoring requirements as established by the Federal Government via Uniform Guidance, otherwise known as the "Supercircular" or "2 CFR 200".

II. POLICY STATEMENT

The Subrecipient Contract & Monitoring Policy is established in order to ensure compliance with federal regulations (known as CFRs) applicable to subrecipient contracts, sometimes also known as Subrecipient Award Letters. Further, the policy outlines requirements of on-going subrecipient monitoring based on risk assessments. Proper implementation of this policy will prevent further Federal Single Audit findings and potential future questioned costs and lost funding as a result of subsequent findings related to these topics.

III. SCOPE

The policy's effective date is immediate as of the date of publication of the policy, November 18, 2019. The policy is applicable to all county grant personnel, county personnel responsible for reviewing and approving contracts, and subrecipients with awards effective during the 2019 audit period, including subrecipient award letters / contracts.

The contract requirements as well as the risk assessment and monitoring requirements stated in this policy are applicable to contracts executed between the county and agencies performing grant work on behalf of the county using funding originally awarded to the county, which is formalized via a subrecipient contract. All other contract elements already a part of county contracts are not within the scope of this policy.

IV. DEFINITIONS

SUBRECIPIENT means a non-Federal entity that receives a subaward from a pass-through entity to carry out part of a Federal Program per 2 CFR 200.330. Further explained, an entity is considered a SUBRECIPIENT when:

- 1) The entity determines who is eligible to receive Federal assistance,
- Has its performance measured in relation to whether objectives of a Federal program were met,

- 3) Has responsibility for programmatic decision making,
- Is responsible for adherence to applicable Federal Program requirements specified in the Federal Award, and
- 5) In accordance with its agreement, uses Federal funds to carry out a program for a public purpose specified in authorizing statute, as opposed to providing goods and services for the benefit of the pass-through entity.

CONTRACTOR (VENDOR) means a non-Federal entity that signs a contract with the county for the purpose of obtaining goods and services for the non-Federal entity's own use and creates a procurement relationship with the county. Per 2 CFR 200.330, characteristics of a procurement relationship are when the CONTRACTOR (VENDOR):

- 1) Provides the goods and services within normal business operations,
- 2) Provides similar goods or services to many different purchasers,
- 3) Normally operates in a competitive environment,
- Provides goods or services that are ancillary to the operation of the Federal Program, and
- Is not subject to compliance requirements of the Federal program as a result of the agreement, though similar requirements may apply for other reasons.

CFR means "Code of Federal Regulations", which codifies federal compliance requirements regarding grant awards of federal funds, including those ultimately distributed to subrecipients. Failure to comply with CFRs constitutes a violation of federal law and subjects the county to potential liability via loss of future funding and/or determination that funding already expended must be repaid.

V. PROCEDURES

a. Subrecipient Determination

Before a contract is written, the entity under consideration must be determined to be either a subrecipient or contractor using the criteria from this policy, section IV. Definitions. The determination should be made in writing or using a form, and should include sign offs for the preparer that made the initial determination as well as the reviewer who made the final approval of the determination of the entity as either a subrecipient or a contractor. As previously noted in section II. Scope, this policy, including the following procedures, are only applicable to those entities determined to be subrecipients.

b. Federal Award Identification Requirements

For entities determined to be subrecipients, contracts will be created per department practices. However, all subrecipient contracts must include a "Federal Award Identification" coversheet, which includes all required elements of subrecipient contracts per 45 CFR part 75 Section 352(a). The cover sheet, which can be customized by each county department, must include all of the following elements to be in compliance with 45 CFR part 75 Section 352(a):

1) Federal Award identification

- Subrecipient name (which must match the name associated with its unique entity identifier)
- 3) Subrecipient's unique entity identifier
- 4) Federal Award Identification Number (FAIN)
- Federal award date of award to the recipient by the federal awarding agency (i.e., the date the federal or state department awarded the funds to the county)
- 6) Subaward period of performance start and end date
- Amount of Federal funds obligated by this action by the pass-through entity to the subrecipient
- Total amount of Federal funds obligated to the subrecipient by the passthrough entity including the current obligation
- Total amount of the Federal award committed to the subrecipient by the pass-thru entity
- Federal award project description, as required to be responsive to the Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act (FFATA)
- Name of the Federal awarding agency, pass-through entity, and contract information for awarding official of the pass-through entity
- 12) CFDA number and name; the pass-through entity must identify the dollar amount made available under each Federal award and the CFDA number at the time of disbursement
- 13) Identification of whether the award is for research & development (R&D)
- Indirect cost rate for the Federal award (including if the de minimis rate is charged)

c. Subrecipient Risk Assessment

All subrecipient contracts must include a "Subrecipient Risk Assessment Certification" in order to fulfill the requirements of 2 CFR 200.331(b). The purpose of the risk assessment certification is to evaluate the subrecipient's risk of noncompliance with Federal statutes, regulations, and the terms and conditions of a subaward. It is highly recommended that a risk assessment be completed for the potential subrecipient before a contract with a potential subrecipient is executed. Questions asked in a subrecipient risk assessment certification may vary between awards, but the following factors should be considered and addressed, regardless of the program:

- 1) The subrecipient's prior experience with the same or similar subawards
- 2) The results of previous audits, including whether or not the subrecipient receives a single audit in accordance with subpart F and the extent to which the same or similar subaward has been audited as a major program
- Whether the subrecipient has new personnel or new or substantially changed systems
- The extent and results of the federal awarding agency's monitoring reports, if applicable

The subrecipient risk assessment certification form will be reviewed by the program manager and a qualitative risk level of lower, moderate, or higher risk will be assigned. The risk should be documented in writing and approved by the department head or designee.

If a risk of moderate or higher is identified, the Deputy Finance Director in the County Finance Department should be notified so that additional procedures and/or reviews of reports can take place to mitigate the increased risk. Although such procedures will be developed at the sole discretion of the County Finance Department, a resource with an expansive list of potential procedures is provided in Form D – AGA Subrecipient Monitoring. The audit program ultimately developed by the County Finance Department will need to be completed by program personnel (with the assistance of county finance personnel). Once completed, the result of the procedures performed will be evaluated and a decision regarding use of the potential subrecipient will be made by the County Finance Department.

Generally, higher risk potential subrecipients as identified by this process will be denied subsequent subrecipient contracts.

d. Subrecipient Monitoring

Subrecipient monitoring must be performed per 2 CFR 200.331(d) "as necessary to ensure that the subaward is used for authorized purposes, in compliance with Federal statutes, regulations, and the terms and conditions of the subaward; and that subaward performance goals are achieved. Required elements are:

- 1) Reviewing financial and performance reports
- Following up with the subrecipient to ensure that actions are taken timely regarding all deficiencies pertaining to the Federal Award passed through from the county as detected by audits, grant monitoring visits, and other on-site reviews
- Issuing a management decision for audit findings pertaining to the Federal Award passed through from the county as required by 2 CFR 200.521

Subrecipient monitoring should occur each year and ideally, will be substantially completed by simply completing the steps outlined in Section V(c), Subrecipient Risk Assessment. However, if issues are noted specific to the subrecipient's audit report and/or single audit that relate to the county's program, than a more detailed evaluation must take place before a management decision can be issued. Actions taken by the county will include one or both of the following:

- Performing an on-site review, focusing on deficient controls, etc., as detailed in applicable single audit / grant monitoring reports.
- Performing a wide scope, general on-site monitoring visit using Form D AGA Subrecipient Monitoring as a guide in order to document general internal controls and internal control performance within the subrecipient organization.

After the above steps, as needed, are completed, a management decision should be rendered indicating that the subrecipient's corrective actions taken are either sufficient or deficient. Continued deficiencies by a subrecipient should result in termination of the subrecipient contract and potential legal action to recover lost / misused federal funds, where applicable.

e. Modification of Existing Subrecipient Contracts

Although the practice in Macomb County is for the departments that manage grant programs to write policies for those applicable grants, repeated findings in the Federal Single Audits for Macomb County in calendar years 2017 and 2018 have necessitated the County Finance Department to write a county-wide policy in order to ensure subsequent compliance with 2 CFR 200, which had an effective date of December 26, 2014.

Because Federal regulations are already enacted that require the content of this policy to be in effect, the content of this policy must be retroactively applied to all subrecipient contracts already in effect currently, or that were in effect for any portion of the applicable program's fiscal year 2019. This could include multi-year subrecipient contracts that were executed prior to 2019, but have service periods that have run into the applicable program's fiscal year 2019. In short, any subrecipient contracts that covered any period of time with a program year that will be subject to audit as part of the county's 2019 Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) and Federal Single Audit will be subject to the content of this policy and must be retroactively applied.

Using section IV. Definitions, each department in the county with grants should evaluate all contracts for potential subrecipient relationships. For any newly found entities or those already identified as subrecipients previously, section V, parts 'a' through 'c' apply and must be immediately brought into compliance with the applicable CFRs cited in those sections.

VI. FORMS

The following examples of forms have been provided for use by county departments in developing templates. These forms should be carefully reviewed and modified as needed by each department with federal awards.

- Form A Subrecipient Contract Cover Sheet Federal Award Identification (see Section V(b))
- b. Form B Subrecipient Risk Assessment with Audit Certification (see Section V(c))
- Form C AGA Subrecipient vs Contractor Checklist (see Section V(a))
- Form D AGA Subrecipient Monitoring (see Section V(d))

VII. FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Common questions asked about this policy will be added periodically as the need arises. The following are anticipated questions regarding this policy:

 QUESTION #1.
 Does this policy apply to all contracts applicable to my grant?

 ANSWER #1.
 All contracts and/or relationships involving payments should be evaluated for potential identification as a subrecipient contract as outlined in Section IV. However, the policy covers just subrecipient contracts, and thus is only applicable to those arrangements.

- QUESTION #2. Is my subrecipient contract in compliance with this policy if the required elements as described in Section V(b) are documented throughout the contract agreement rather than in a lead sheet?
- ANSWER #2. No. While such a document would be compliance with 45 CFR part 75 Section 352(a), this policy, FIN.2019.001, requires a lead sheet to be used so that contract reviewers, state/Federal grant monitors, and financial / Federal Single auditors can easily trace the required elements to one location, regardless of department or grant. This will result in a lower risk of potential grant non-compliance.
- QUESTION #3. How often must a new subrecipient risk assessment certification be completed?
 - ANSWER #3. Subrecipient risk assessments must be completed for each new or renewing subrecipient contract. If a subrecipient contract is for greater than one year in duration, then an audit certification should be completed annually, reviewed by the grant manager, and used to update the subrecipient's risk assessment. Procedures per Section V(d) should be followed regarding monitoring as needed.
- QUESTION #4. How long can the term of a subrecipient contract be? ANSWER #4. A subrecipient contract can be no longer than the term of the Subaward Performance Period as defined in Section V(b)(6) and cited from 45 CFR part 75 Section 352(a).
- QUESTION #5.
 If a subrecipient contract expired before the date of this policy, but on or after the beginning of a program year covering any part of 2019 audit period, does this policy apply to that subrecipient contract?

 ANSWER #5.
 Yes. All subrecipient contracts active for any program year that will be reported on the 2019 CAFR must comply with this policy. See Section V(e).

VIII. RESPONSIBILITIES

Responsibilities regarding the contract creation and contract routing process are not changed by this policy. Contract generation, amendments, and general contract administration continue to be the sole responsibility of the originating departments, however, the new processes are assigned as follows:

- Subrecipient Determination (Section V(a)) is the responsibility of the department head, but can be delegated to a program manager or other designee.
- b. Federal Award Identification Requirements (Section V(b)) is the responsibility of the preparer of the subrecipient contract. Additionally, it is the responsibility of all personnel in the contract routing / approval process chain to review contracts for the Federal Award Identification Cover Sheet and, if absent or incomplete, reject the contract.

- c. Subrecipient Risk Assessment (Section V(c)) is the responsibility of the department head, but can be delegated to a program manager or other designee. Additionally, it is the responsibility of all personnel in the contract routing / approval process chain to review contracts for the Subrecipient Risk Assessment and, if absent or incomplete, reject the contract.
- d. Subrecipient Monitoring (Section V(d)) is the responsibility of the department head, although this may typically be delegated to the program manager or other designee.
- e. Modification of Existing Subrecipient Contracts (Section V(e)) is the responsibility of the department head, but can be delegated to a program manager or other designee.

All personnel impacted by this policy per section VIII(a) through (e) are responsible for reading and understanding the entirety of this document.

The Macomb County Director of Finance (or their designee) is responsible for the content of this policy as well as for updating this policy. This policy shall be reviewed by no later than October 1, 2022 and every three (3) years thereafter.

IX. ENFORCEMENT

Internally, the contract routing / approval process will enforce this policy. Additionally, the annual internal audit of each fund in the county may discover potential lack of compliance with this policy. Finally, the annual external audit and Federal Single Audit will also identify compliance issues, which may result in penalties from audit findings up to and including loss of funding and loss of grant funded personnel related to lost grant funding.
