RESOLUTION TO: Recommend that the Macomb County Board of Commissioners authorize the Macomb County Community Services Agency to receive \$34,300 from the Michigan IDA Partnership and the Oakland Livingston Human Service Agency.

INTRODUCED BY: Commissioner Carey Torrice, Chair Public Services Committee

Background: Since 2001, our Individual Development Account (IDA) Program has provided families an opportunity to build resources with the goal of purchasing their first home in Macomb County. The Michigan IDA Partnership and the Oakland Livingston Human Service Agency will be providing the accounts. We were recently awarded match and direct service funds for ten (10) accounts.

Funding Amount: \$ 30,000 (Michigan IDA Partnership Match funds)
\$ 4,300 (Direct Service funds for managing accounts)
Total \$ 34,300 (No County match required)

Period of Performance: April 1, 2010 through March 31, 2015.
(MCCSA received official notification of these accounts on July 27, 2010)

Funding Utilization: Families enrolled in the program make monthly contributions toward a savings account for up to two (2) years. When a customer sets aside their funds in a savings account, their contributions are matched at a 3:1 ratio utilizing the grant funds. The combined savings account is used for the down payment and closing costs on the purchase of their first home in Macomb County. Customers must follow the established guidelines as found in our brochure.

(Since program inception, 16 families have purchased a first home in Macomb County through the IDA Program)

Customer Eligibility Requirements: Families at or below 200% of the poverty level would qualify for the Individual Development Account (IDA) Program. (For example: Total household income for a family of four (4) cannot exceed \$44,112.)

MACOMB COUNTY COMMISSION ON WOMEN 2010 Annual Report

Since the adoption of Resolution five dated February 14, 2008 by the Macomb County Board of Commissioners to establish the Commission on Women in Macomb County (MCCW) an operating structure is governed by Elected Officers, By-Laws, Policies and Procedures. The MCCW continues to operate in support of Women's issues. However, the potential to qualify as a non-profit charitable organization is essential to further embrace the community of women in Macomb County and engage appointed members to achieve the stated mission and supporting goals. This report documents the positive direction the MCCW has taken over the last year with the election of a new chair, the continuance of work from returning members, the appointment of new members, and the findings herewith founded by the actions of each member assigned to the Commissions chaired program subcommittees. **MISSION** *The mission of the Macomb County Commission on Women (MCCW) is to create synergy to advocate, educate, and motivate the community on issues that concern the well-being and economic status of women.*

GOALS The MCCW will study issues of concern surrounding the population of women residing in Macomb County. This entity will make recommendations to the Macomb County Board of Commissioners that will allow the flow of information on women's issues to its public thus increasing overall awareness that will lend to the growth and establishing of partnerships, building of coalitions, and to take action to improve the community of Macomb County Women.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Linked MCCW webpage to the Macomb County website increasing public awareness.
- Unveiled MCCW Logo as identification or personal branding. (see attach)
- Recognizing "Best Places for Women to Work" in Macomb County.
- Published information about accessing mental health services in Macomb County.
- Researched fund raising potential.
- Established eligibility to qualify MCCW as 501(c)(3) non-profit, tax-exempt charitable organization.

PROGRAM SUBCOMMITTEES

Community Resources provides networking opportunities Macomb County Women. A proposed Symposium is ready to proceed if the Resolution allowing the MCCW to generate funds is approved. **501(c)(3)** explores and verifies whether the MCCW qualifies as a non-profit, tax exempt, charitable organization. Research has confirmed the MCCW may qualify. However, authorization by the BOC through amended to the current Resolution must be provided prior to the MCCW collecting any funds.

Finance/Fund Establish mechanisms for receipts and disbursements of all funds from fund raising, donations, and grants.

Mental Health is to help uninsured and under-insured women access affordable mental health services for themselves and their families. An informational brochure was created and posted to the MCCW webpage.

Pay Equity was formed to recognize women-friendly work places in Macomb County.

Political Process to increase awareness of the political process through increased voter registration for all women

Elections & Rules conducts elections of MCCW officers. Enforcing/Amending By-Laws, Policies and Procedures as required. Officers were elected and changes have been identified that need to be to comply with the new County Executive beginning January 1, 2011.

Communications feed timely and meaningful information on an external basis. Maintain press releases and MCCW webpage via procedures.

Recommendations

1. Receive support from the Macomb County Board of Commissioners for the continuation of the Commission on Women.
2. To adopt an amendment to the Resolution to appoint two (2) members from each of the 13 Commissioner's Districts beginning with January 1, 2011 applications for appointment leaving a 26 member board intact.
3. To adopt an amendment to the Resolution granting appointment of two members from the County Executive.
4. To proceed with the application for Resolution approving the 501(c)(3) non-profit, tax-exempt charitable organization status.
