RESOLUTION REQUESTING STATE ASSISTANCE IN THE FUNDING OF 42ND DISTRICT COURTS, DIVISION I AND II

WHEREAS, the County of Macomb has within its borders district courts which include the 37th, 38th, 39th, 40th, 41-A, 41-B and the 42nd District Court, Division I and II, and

WHEREAS, all of the district courts, except the 42nd District Court, Division I and II are district courts of the third class and whose district funding unit(s) or district control unit(s) are the cities or townships in which the district court has jurisdiction. The 42nd District Court, Division I, which consists of the Cities of Memphis and Richmond, the Townships of Bruce, Washington, Armada, Ray and Richmond and the 42nd District Court, Division II, which consists of the City of New Baltimore and the Townships of Lennox and Chesterfield are, pursuant to MCL 600.8122(7), districts of the second class, and

WHEREAS, district courts of the first or second class, including the 42nd District Court, Division I and II have the local county as their district funding unit or district control unit, and

WHEREAS, a district funding unit, by state statute, is responsible for maintaining, financing and operating the court, and

WHEREAS, the total responsibility for funding the 42nd District Court, Division I and II falls upon all tax payers of the County of Macomb, the majority of which are already supporting, through their tax dollars paid to their local municipality, district courts where they live, and

WHEREAS, the County of Macomb for the year 2010 has budgeted \$1,071,278 to support Division I of the 42nd District Court and \$1,333,290 to fund the activities of Division II of the 42nd District Court, and

WHEREAS, the County of Macomb has no option but to support the 42nd District Court, Division I and II because of the state statutes making them second class district courts and further, requiring revenues generated from those courts to be shared with the state and local municipalities, resulting in what is the equivalent of an unfunded mandate, and

WHEREAS, the funding of the 42nd District Court, Division I and II is a double taxation burden upon the majority of the taxpayers in Macomb County because of their support of district courts in areas where they reside and pay taxes.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Macomb County Board of Commissioners hereby implores the state legislature to adopt legislation to either: (1) Allow the County of Macomb in its support of the 42nd District Court, Division I and II to retain all or most of the monies generated from fines and fees before any such money is remitted to the state and local municipalities. (2) Amend the state statute to require the state to pay for any monetary deficit incurred with the County in the running of those courts. (3) Provide that the 42nd District Court no longer be a district court of the second class but be made a court of the third class.

RE: Technology and Communications Committee Monthly Report

State Budget:

The Governor's Fiseal Year 2010-11 budget recommendation was presented on Thursday, February 11th and addresses a projected \$1.5 billion shortfall through a combination of cuts and revenue enhancements. Under the present political climate, the likelihood of her recommended revenue enhancements (including the Physician Quality Assurance Assessment Program "QAAP" and expansion of the sales tax to services) being passed by the legislature before the November election is unlikely at best. As such, we are anticipating the legislative process to meet the constitutional requirement for a balanced budget through additional cuts. While we are indeed pleased that the recommendation increased revenue sharing payments to counties by \$59.4 million and increased statutory payments by \$3,496,867 to offset an equal decline in constitutional payments, again without revenue, we will be fighting to retain these recommended payments. The recommendation also eliminates the distribution language that reflected the reduced funding to counties in FY 2009-10 budget due to the recommendation providing full funding for payments to counties.

Macomb Business Incubator:

The Governor's budget recommendation eliminated funding for the business incubator program. All of the eligible incubators, located in Detroit, Houghton, Ingham, Kalamazoo, Kent, Macomb, Muskegon, and Washtenaw counties totaling \$950,000, were removed. We have been working elosely with Representative Jon Switalski on restoring the Macomb County Incubator funding. One of the only budgets ready to be moved by the respective appropriations subcommittee is the General Government budget that will contain the incubator funding. We are anticipating that budget to be moved by the subcommittee the week of March 15th and will be doing everything we can to see that funding for the incubator is included in the subcommittee version and retained throughout the legislative process.

Macomb Trail:

The meeting we scheduled here in the County with one of the members of the Natural Resources Trust Fund Board went extremely well. We were able to discuss a number of aspects to the process that should help Mr. Crumm maximize the score for the application that will be due April 1st. We intend to hold additional meetings with both Board members and staff to gather as much information as possible prior to the application deadline and throughout the summer before the final application

recommendations are presented to the Trust Fund Board. We will continue working closely with Commissioner Bruley and Mr. Crumm on the project.

County Jail Reimbursement:

We are pleased to report that we have cleared the first hurdle in our attempt to restore the cuts to the jail reimbursement program. House Bill 5406, sponsored by Representative George Cushingberry (D-Detroit) was passed unanimously by the House Appropriations committee. Thanks to the collaborative efforts on our behalf with Representative Alma Wheeler Smith (D-South Lyon), Representative Matt Lori (R-Constantine) and Tom Hickson from the Michigan Association of Counties, the committee reported a substitute that restores funding for the current budget year. We are most proud of the fact that we were able to secure language within the version as passed by the committee that reinstates the reimbursements for eligible jail inmates retroactive to January 2010. While there is still a great deal of work to do before this legislation becomes law, this is certainly a positive step in the right direction.
