

RE: Technology and Communications Committee Monthly Report

State Budget:

The first series of budget bills has begun moving through the process. The Senate has passed seven budget bills (Community Colleges, Community Health, Corrections, Education, Higher Education, School Aid and Natural Resources & Environment). The House has passed six budget bills (Agriculture, Energy, Labor & Eeonomic Growth, General Government, Judiciary, Military & Veterans Affairs, and State Police). The House still has yet to approve budget bills for Human Services and Transportation – Transportation was placed on the board for a vote by the full House and because in its present form it fails to fully fund the state match to draw the full federal funding, the vote was reconsidered and postponed. Both the Senate- and House-passed versions are in their respective chamber's subcommittees and are seheduled for hearings beginning the week of April 12th when the legislature returns from the two-week spring break.

While we are pleased to report that the House-passed version of the General Government budget (House Bill 5880) increased revenue sharing payments to counties by \$59.4 million and also increased statutory payments to cities, villages and townships by approximately 1%, because the bill was passed without securing the actual revenue enhancements recommended by the Governor (including the Physician Quality Assurance Assessment Program (QAAP) and expansion of the sales tax to services), the likelihood these increases will be approved by the Senate is near zero at best. Based on our conversations with the Chair of the Senate Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government, holding counties harmless is the best case scenario while the best case for cities, villages and townships is likely a further 5% reduction.

Macomb Business Incubator:

We are pleased to report that our efforts with Representative Jon Switalski have resulted in the House-passed version of the General Government budget containing \$250,000 for the Macomb County Business Incubator. This, of course, would be an increase of \$150,000 over the current year funding level, and we will be working as tirelessly as possible to see that this increase is retained by the Senate. Unfortunately, we have run into a problem with the current year funding stream (which of course could translate to a similar problem with the Fiscal Year 2010-11 funding). We are being told that because of some limitations on the actual funds available within the Michigan Economic Development Corporation (M.E.D.C.) and the language written into the current year budget requiring the first

\$250,000 available to be distributed to Detroit's "Tech Town", the M.E.D.C. only has roughly \$37,000 available and as such will issue that entire amount to Tech Town and the balance due to Tech Town and all of the other incubator payments due in the current year will not be made. Clearly, we need to address the current year funding IMMEDIATELY. We are working with House Appropriations Chairman George Cushingberry (D-Detroit) to hold a hearing on the funding shortfall in either full Appropriations committee or in his special Investigations Subcommittee as soon as the legislature returns from the spring break. Clearly this matter will need to be resolved, not only for the current year, but also to ensure that the funding we are pursuing in the upcoming fiscal year is indeed available.

Macomb Trail:

We continue our efforts with Mr. Crumm and Commissioner Bruley on the trail. Because of the sensitive nature of the relationship with Selfridge Air Force Base, we have been asked to delay the initial application. As such, we are working with our contacts within the Trust Fund Board and staff to see if an acquisition application ean indeed be submitted in August or if we will now need to wait until April 1st of next year. We will continue working elosely with Commissioner Bruley and Mr. Crumm on the project.

District Court Changes:

Based on the resolution approved by the Technology and Communications Committee and auticipating approval by the full Board, we have begun working on changes to the District Court divisions in our attempt to relieve the financial burden placed on the County by the 42nd District Court. Unfortunately, we have run into some resistance in the Senate. We will, of course, continue to pursue any and all options for legislation to be introduced in the Senate to address the concern, but at present our effort will once again likely shift to the House of Representatives in our attempt to secure initial legislative support and what we hope to be a bill introduction.
