3) Guest Speaker

CNS Healthcare is a private, non-profit organization that offers community-based behavioral health services. The nationally recognized Anti-Stigma program began in 2005. The Anti-Stigma team is dedicated to educating people about the importance of eliminating stigma in mental health. Utilizing a combination of music and personal testimonies, the Anti-Stigma presentation emphasized that hope and recovery is possible and that people with mental health conditions are no different than those that are without mental health conditions. Awareness of Behavioral Health Services

MCHD revealed current work progress on a behavioral health resource map. The map is designed through ArcGIS and is a way for individuals to access services based upon their respective needs. When an individual clicks on a particular symbol on the map, they can learn more about the location of the service. Information available includes the name of the service, the address, and a phone number for contacting the provider. Additionally, some locations may include websites or specific meeting times.

Group Updates

Community Mental Health – CMH will be holding a Mental Health First Aid training at the Macomb Community College on March 21st. The training is open exclusively to MCC students at this time.

Easterseals – Walk-In Case Management has begun at Easterseals. Open to anyone. As of now, the hours are Monday through Thursday, 10 AM to 1 PM.

Judson Center – The grant awarded integrated health clinic is on track to be finished by February 1st. Judson Center has previously only contained behavioral health services on site, but will now have the capacity to hold a clinic that will see patients for physical ailments in addition to behavioral services.

CARE – CARE is going to begin holding monthly Naloxone trainings on site. Stay tuned for more information and dates. They are also beginning a home visit service within the elderly population to educate on the risks of opioid use disorder. CARE is offering 0-5 year old case management through their family check-up model program. Please advise there are income and age requirements for this service. Additionally, CARE has also announced they will be opening a recovery community center in the future.

MCEMSMA – The Macomb County EMS Medical Authority was recently awarded a special grant to pilot a program that checks up on individuals who have recently been administered Naloxone. If an individual was picked up by EMS for an overdose and they were given Naloxone, EMS will follow up with the individual 24-48 hours after to offer services.
