Two Men Arraigned for Armed Robbery of a Warren Dispensary

Mount Clemens, MI - Today, two men from Eastpointe were arraigned in connection with a shooting and armed robbery of the Sherwood Dispensary in Warren.

It is alleged that on Friday, June 9, 2023, Lavall Perkins, 64 years-old, and Michael Graham, 48 years-old, caused a disturbance outside of the dispensary. An unidentified suspect shot through the glass door hitting the victim. The unidentified suspect unlocked the door and shot at the victim again as he was retreating. The unidentified suspect and Lavall Perkins entered the store and stole the safe. Both robbers exited the store to a waiting Chevy Tahoe.. Michael Graham allegedly was driving the Chevy Tahoe.

Lavall Perkins and Michael Graham are both charged with Assault with intent to Murder (life felony), Conspiracy to Commit Armed Robbery (life felony), Armed Robbery (life felony), and Felony Firearm (felony with a mandatory two year prison sentence).

Both were arraigned in Warren 37th District Court. District Court Judge Michael Chupa set bond for Lavall Perkins at \$500,000.00 cash/surety. If he is released on bond Perkins is to have a steel cuff GPS tether, no possession of any firearms and must surrender all of his firearms to the Warren Police Department. Judge Chupa set bond at \$600,000.00 for Michael Graham and upon release on bond Graham is to have a steel cuff GPS tether, no possession of any firearms and must surrender all of his firearms to the Warren Police Department and have no contact with the location of the crime.

The probable cause hearing for both men is scheduled for Tuesday, June 20, 2023 and the preliminary exam is scheduled for Tuesday, June 27, 2023 in Warren District Court.

"I am committed to upholding justice and safeguarding our communities. Together with the Warren Police Department, we will ensure that the perpetrators face the consequences of their violent deeds, sending a clear message that our community will not tolerate such cowardly acts," said Macomb County Prosecutor Peter J. Lucido.

The Macomb County Prosecutor's office represents the people. We are committed to achieving justice and following the laws of the State of Michigan. All that are accused of a crime are presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.
