## Detroit man arraigned for gas station shooting incident

Mount Clemens, MI - Today, a Detroit man was arraigned in connection with a shooting at a St. Clair Shores gas station.

It is alleged that on Friday, November 10, 2023, De-onta Smith-Haynes, age 33, shot the victim after the victim swung a punch at him in the parking lot of a gas station. Smith-Haynes fled the scene. The victim is expected to recover.

Smith-Haynes is being charged with Assault with Intent to Murder (life felony), Carrying a Concealed Weapon (five year felony), Felon in Possession of a Firearm (five year felony), and Felony Firearm (two year mandatory felony).

The defendant was arraigned in St. Clair Shores District Court by Magistrate Ted Metry where bond was set at \$300,000 cash/surety. Smith-Haynes was also ordered to have a mental health assessment and if released on bond is to have a steel GPS tether, no weapons, no contact with the victim, and not to leave the state of Michigan. A probable cause hearing is scheduled for Tuesday, November 28, 2023 at 8:30 am and the preliminary exam is scheduled for Friday, December 1, 2023 at 9:00 am in front of St. Clair Shores District Court Judge Mark Fatarcangeli.

"As part of our commitment to community well-being, we require a mental health evaluation as a condition of bond for gun-related crimes. This proactive policy not only addresses immediate legal consequences but also aims to prevent gun crimes by addressing potential underlying mental health concerns, contributing to a safer society," said Macomb County Prosecutor Peter J. Lucido.
