Man arraigned for shooting after family argument on Thanksgiving

Mt. Clemens, MI - The Macomb County Prosecutor's Office charged and arraigned a 35 year-old Clinton Twp. man in connection with a shooting in Warren after a family dispute in the early hours of November 25, 2022.

It is alleged that late Thanksgiving night, a brother and sister had an argument over the sister being disrespectful towards their mother. This led to the sister's boyfriend, Michael Kamal Sinnawi, threatening the brother. The brother and Sinnawi made plans to meet up for a physical fight. The brother was driven to a family member's home in the area of 12 Mile and Schoenherr Road by the victim to wait for Sinnawi. Sinnawi, with his girlfriend in the passenger seat, drove up to the victim's car in front of the house and shot the victim five times as the victim sat in the driver's seat. Sinnawi fled. When Warren police officers arrived, they provided life saving measures. The brother and sister were not injured in the incident.

Sinnawi is charged with assault with intent to murder (a felony punishable by up to life,) discharge of a firearm from a vehicle causing injury (15 year felony), possession of a firearm (5 year felony), and two counts of felony firearm (2 year felony).

"This is another example of Warren police not only putting their lives on the line for us every day, but actually saving a life," said Macomb County Prosecutor Peter J. Lucido.

The defendant was arraigned Tuesday, November 30, 2022 in front of Judge Faunce who set a \$1 Million bond cash/surety only, with a GPS tether if released on bond. Judge Chupa will hold the Probable Cause Conference on December 6, 2022 and the Preliminary Examination on December 13, 2022 in Warren District Court.

The Macomb County Prosecutor's office represents the people. We are committed to achieving justice and following the laws of the State of Michigan. All that are accused of a crime are presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.
