Roseville high schooler brings gun to school

MOUNT CLEMENS - The Macomb County Prosecutor's Office has charged a juvenile with one count carrying a concealed weapon (5 year felony) and one count possession of a weapon in a weapon-free school zone (93 day misdemeanor).

"The Macomb County Prosecutor's Office has zero tolerance for guns in schools," said Macomb County Prosecutor Peter J. Lucido. "The student who saw something and said something is a hero in my book. Safety is everyone's responsibility."

It is alleged that on November 9, 2022, an eleventh grader witnessed worrisome behavior between two students at Roseville High School and believed one of the students had a gun in his backpack. The student notified a school counselor who notified school administration. Roseville High School Principal and Assistant Principal along with the Security Resource Officer located the student suspected of having a weapon. The child was searched and the Principal opened his backpack and saw a firearm. The Security Resource Officer handcuffed the juvenile and retrieved the Glock 9mm firearm with an extended magazine. The gun was determined to be loaded with a round in the chamber. The suspect denied the gun was his. Later it was found, the firearm was stolen out of Bloomfield Twp.

Today, the suspect went in front of Macomb County Juvenile Referee Linda Harrison. Referee Harrison accepted and authorized the petition charging the juvenile with the two counts. Assistant Prosecutor Marian Dwaihy-Briske requested the court detain the juvenile without bond. Referee Harrison agreed and indicated the court will attempt to transfer the case to Wayne County where the juvenile resides. Referee Harrison set a control date of November 11, 2022 at 1:30 pm. The juvenile is being held at the Macomb County Juvenile Justice Center.
