INTRODUCTION OF NEW BOARD MEMBERS

Chair Simek introduced Dr. Rodney Tolbert Sr. as the newest board member. Dr. Tolbert gave a brief overview of his career.

PRESENTATION BY DETROIT INSTITUTE OF ARTS

Report from the DIA Director, President & CEO, Mr. Salvador Salort-Pons:

The Claude Monet-Frederic Church exhibit brought in 70,000 visitors.

Upcoming exhibits:

Playball! A baseball card exhibit opens March 28, 2018 and is a free event. The DIA is working with the Detroit Tigers to bring fans in on game days to see this event and peak interest for other events. Star Wars – The Power of Costumes exhibit opens May 20, 2018 and is a ticketed event. It will focus on the creative process the designers follow from drawings and sketches to the final product. Tri county residents will receive a discount. The Asian galleries exhibit will be opening in the fall and is a free event. This collection includes artwork from Korea, China and India. An exhibit in fashion and art will be opening in December and is a free event. The DIA will be working with a group called "Sew Great Detroit" which involves groups of young ladies sewing projects that will be shown in the museum. Additional exhibits in the next few years will include a car design exhibit to be tied into the auto show; an African American art exhibit; Van Gogh in America in 2020 to revolve around the fact that the DIA is the first museum in the United States to acquire a painting by Van Gogh. A new gallery called "Out of the Crate", will be opening showing gifts and acquisitions to the DIA.

A suggestion was made to create a video, narrated by Mr. Salort-Pons, to be viewed upon entry to the museum. This will give visitors an awareness as to what to look for as they walk through the museum.

A grant that was received by the Art Bridges Foundation will bring American art to outreaching areas in the state of Michigan. The exhibit will be in the tri-county area in 2020. A grant was also received by the United Knight Foundation supporting moving technology which will provide special tours for visitors including a 3-D map. There are two open positions in the museum, Vice-President for Development and Head of Exhibitions, which should be filled very soon.

Public Affairs Update - Dave Flynn

The service agreement states the DIA will come out three times per year; January to present the program plan and community partnerships in the upcoming year; April meeting after the audit to provide numbers; and August will be the mid-year review and general update. The DIA is working to expand relationships with K-12 communities, colleges within cities and townships, library directors, senior organizations and chambers of commerce. "County Connections" newsletter is now being sent to over 400 people in Macomb County. The Public Affairs office is also developing a mapping project to show where the DIA has been throughout counties in the past 5 years and the services provided.

The Anton Art Center has increased opportunities to work with the DIA. A senior creativity program was implemented in December with a grant funded through the Community Foundation of S.E. Michigan.
