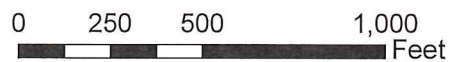

Subject: Inspection & Cleaning of the Enclosed Section of the Drain

The Board authorized the MCPWO to facilitate an inspection and cleaning of the enclosed portion of the Vokes Relief Drain in May of 2023. At that time the amount of sediment and debris within the pipe was not known. Upon the start of the project, it became clear that there was a significant amount of sediment and debris within the pipe. In fact, the average depth of sediment and debris encountered in the elliptical portion of the Drain was 4-feet which significantly reduced the storage and conveyance capacity of the system. The reduced storage and conveyance capacity resulted in flooding, especially in large wet weather events.

While the original design intent is not known, it appears the main truck of system is to function as a wet system. With little change in elevation between the weir east of Van Dyke and the Clinton River, a shallow, oversized system with a downstream weir provides relief during wet weather and protection during high water in the Clinton River. It is possible that the long-term vision included the enclosure of the Drain to Utica Road or potentially the Clinton River. What is known is that over the past 50 plus years a significant amount of sediment and debris accumulated in the system which required extensive and laborious efforts to clean. Since this is a wet system, the Contractor had to run pumps frequently to lower water levels to allow cleaning to occur and the project was impacted often due to wet weather and snow melt.

The Vokes Drain consists of open and enclosed sections, see attached maps for reference. The enclosed sections of the Drain are located west of Van Dyke between 18 ½ and 19 Mile Roads. The main truck line of the Drain is approximately 3,677 linear feet of large diameter elliptical pipe that comprise sections 1, 2, 4, 5, & 6 and consists of 3,519 linear feet of circular pipe that comprise the three branches 3,7,8, & 9 as shown on the attached map. It is estimated that more than 60% of the system was filled with sediment and debris. The contractor removed approximately 4,000 tons of sediment & debris during this project. The removal of this material will mitigate, if not eliminate, the flooding issues that previously occurred.

This project is eligible for the Macomb County Drain Match Program where the County will match 50% of the cost and the District will be responsible for the other 50%. Doetsch Environmental performed the work on a daily rate basis. The dewatering rate is \$2,300 and the cleaning rate is \$4,600. There was no charge for non-working days or for County Personnel time. The total project cost is \$988,100, with the County matching \$494,050 and the Drain District the other \$494,050 from the Sterling Heights drain accounts in the Table below:
